# LIGHT A CANDLE

*by Father Michael*

There are occasions in life where the lighting of a candle takes place. Often the candle lighting is not the end product, but rather it sets the tone for something else which will follow. The variety of events that surround lighting a candle can run the gamut of emotions and experiences. Lighting the candles on a birthday cake is the precursor to a traditional song and shining the spotlight on the guest of honor. Candles can be lit to begin a memorial service or to create a prayerful or reflective environment. A candlelit dinner is not the norm for most meals; it sets the tone for a romantic or celebratory occasion.

The Church shares in this tradition of lighting candles. This weekend we experience one of those traditions as we light the first candle of the Advent wreath. In the coming weeks we will continue to light additional candles as we draw closer to Christmas. While we look forward to Christmas, we cannot ignore the time that precedes it. This time of waiting can be a holy and sacred time in and of itself. What are the prayers of your heart as we light the first candle in preparation to celebrate the birth of our Savior?

I am aware of many parishioners who are carrying heavy burdens at this time. Some are grieving the death of a loved one. Some are sorting their way through difficult medical issues. And some are facing hard financial realities. There are times when the challenges of life feel overwhelming. For others there may not be a personal crisis unfolding, but they are filled with worry, sadness or even anger over events in our nation and beyond. What do we do with these matters of the heart?

There is a part of us that would like to believe that on Christmas day our woes will be resolved, but we know that is not a realistic hope. What is our hope as we light the first candle of the Advent wreath? In what ways is this gesture reflective of what we believe in? What does it mean to once again celebrate the birth of our Savior?

Advent is often a time of contradictory messages and experiences. There are unwritten expectations to shop, decorate, and prepare for a festive Christmas. At the same time the Church proclaims this to be a time of prayerful reflection and preparation. As we light the first candle of the Advent wreath, may it be a time to renew our desire to journey with and be led by the Lord. May these days be a holy time. As we anticipate the coming of the Lord, let us allow the present moment to also be a time of grace and life. Happy Advent!

# LITURGY BYTES

## Happy New Year!!



First Sunday of Advent

Yes, I know we just celebrated Thanksgiving a few days ago. The wish of Happy New Year has to do with the Church's liturgical year. The liturgical year ended last weekend with the feast of Christ the King and begins this weekend with the First Sunday of Advent.

We also will hear a new set of scripture readings, known as Cycle C, with the Gospels being from St. Luke. There are three-year Sunday cycles: A, B and C following every time a different synoptic Gospel. Year A is the Gospel of Matthew, Year B is the Gospel of Mark, and Year C is the Gospel of Luke. The other Gospel, somehow different, of John is used during special Sundays throughout the liturgical year. Each of the evangelists portrays Jesus its own way, as if from a different angle, and seems to address a different set of people.

The Gospel of Luke is read in its entirety on consecutive Sundays every three years. Though the gospel stories appear to be no different from the same ones read last year from Mark or the year before from Matthew, there are some very original stories like that of the Good Samaritan or Prodigal Son that are not found in the other Gospels.

We do not read the Gospel of Luke the way the Jews read the Torah throughout their year, but the texts are selected according to the needs of the season of Advent, which prepares us for the second coming as well as the first coming of Christ. Also this is true in the Christmas season that celebrates the events of Christ's birth, and during Lent where only stories calling for conversion and prayer are used. The most sequential readings from Luke are in Ordinary Time between Christmas and Lent, and between Pentecost and Christ the King.

These are just a few thoughts about Luke's Gospel for us to reflect on today. May you enjoy this Advent season of waiting and anticipation!

## Fall Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "Fall Cash Fling." This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.


