THE FINAL CANDLE

by Father Michael

This year Advent is actually longer than it is most years, as Christmas falls on a Saturday. In spite of it being a long Advent, I hear many people saying it felt like a very quick Advent. (And, as a side note that has nothing to do with anything, has this been an exceedingly long autumn? On several occasions I was convinced I raked up the last of the autumn leaves, only to discover a new wave of them appearing a few days later.) Anyway, there is no rhyme or reason to figure out any of this, but we are unmistakably in our final days before Christmas.

One issue that we need to deal with this year is once again wearing masks for Mass. That is the most recent directive we received from the Diocese, which was in response to the new, New York State mandate. Unfortunately, we did not receive this update until last Monday. In fact, the announcement made last weekend at Mass was a different message. I hope that the short notice does not lead to people being confused or upset when they come to Mass.

If you recall, attendance last Christmas was quite sparse. We anticipated great crowds, added a Mass, required reservations, and in the end many people chose to stay home. This year parishes are speculating on what may happen, but most are anticipating a large turn-out for Mass. Attendance has gone up over the last few weeks here at Holy Cross as well as most parishes. We anticipate the largest crowds to be at the 4:00 PM Mass on Christmas Eve and the 11:30 AM Mass on Christmas Day. The lightest Masses will likely be the 10:00 PM on Christmas Eve and the 8:00 AM on Christmas Day.

This week's gospel reading speaks about Elizabeth experiencing the leaping of the infant (John the Baptist) in her womb when Mary comes to visit her. There is no doubt that a child leaping in the womb is a sign of life and an experience that brings hope and anticipation. We celebrate the birth of our Lord every year. We may take for granted the power of what we proclaim on this day. Christmas is meant to be more than a festival celebration for one day and then returning to our routines as if nothing happened. We pray that this celebration of Christmas may touch our hearts. May we be open to all that Jesus may offer us and respond with faith and trust

While your experience of waiting may be far different than Elizabeth's, may these final days of Advent allow you to be filled with hope and anticipation. May you have a blessed Christmas with your family and loved ones.

HOLY CROSS WEBSITE

JUST SOME WORDS FROM THE WEBMASTER!!! THE PARISH WEBSITE... AND "JUST A LITTLE BIT ABOUT IT"

May I Welcome all of you today along with a statement that many parishioners & staff members have often heard me say. "A Website is a 'Living Entity'... It is never finished or completed... because it is constantly in the midst of updates, changes & growth." Having reiterated this, I hope that you enjoy using this Website as much as I have enjoyed creating it and daily enjoy updating it. With its future growth potential, this Website will excitedly offer to all of our Holy Cross Parish Parishioners as well as our welcomed new, Prospective Parishioners, many more possibilities in the sharing of parish information with all who navigate here.

I have taken great care in creating a Website in which "getting lost" while navigating its pages should be a "thing of the past." At the bottom of each Page there is a Question which asks... "Where Would You Like To Go Now?"... showing direct links to frequently viewed Webpages and thereby making it easier to navigate through the Website without having to always return to the Top Menu Bar. Please be sure to "scroll down" to the bottom of each page and surf it in its entirety in order to not "miss out" on any information that may be "lurking" beyond your screen's viewing area. Some Pages are lengthy and filled with an abundance of information as well as with "links to click" which will direct you elsewhere on the Website for quicker navigating. The Home Page is an example of this type of page.

The <u>Home Page is the "Heart" of the Website</u> and contains much information and "links" to other sources of information. It is comprised of <u>Six Basic Sections</u>: [1] <u>General Parish Information</u>, [2] the "<u>Fast-Track" Section</u> to speed you to particular areas of the Website by asking you Questions, [3] "<u>Church News</u>," [4] "<u>What's Happening</u>" in the Parish, [5] "<u>Parish & Seasonal Upcoming Events</u>" of the Parish & [6] "<u>Schedules</u>" for various Parish Ministries. Should you take the time to routinely navigate this page from top to bottom... it would be like "reading" the weekly Bulletin from cover to cover. Doing this will keep you updated on the "pulse" of the Parish... give you "the scoop" on all the Parish news & activities... and will provide you with the "links" to the appropriate pages for more detailed information, all the while eliminating extensive searching. (Always remember that if you had inadvertently misplaced or already discarded your Bulletin, you can find all of the same information on the Website since the Bulletin and the Website are both always in "sync" with each other.) If you already know the specific location that you wish to visit on the Website, you can use the traditional Menu Bar at the top of each page or the "E-Z" Navigation Page, which I describe in the next paragraph.

The <u>"E-Z" Navigation Page</u> is a very useful "<u>Find and Go-To</u>" feature that I developed specifically for the Parish Website since <u>all of the Website Pages on this page are sorted by Parish Usage & Departmental Categories</u>. I strongly encourage you to try using this page... It truly makes it "E-Z" to navigate and to find your desired page and information quickly. I also <u>encourage you to "Subscribe" with your EMail to Holy Cross on the Home Page</u> in order for you to be able to receive important urgent announcements & information, in the form of "email blasts" (never spam) from the parish in the future. I reiterate that you will never receive any spam from the Holy Cross Website. But most importantly, this will be just another way for the parish & staff members to inform you of important and useful parish information & events more quickly and easily by "keeping you in the loop" of detailed Parish situations.

Should you have any suggestions or ideas about incorporating any other useful Parish Information into the Website, please do not hesitate contacting the Parish Office with those suggestions. If your suggestions are within the capabilities of the Website Design Software, we will consider them to be implemented in future updates & design changes. We always welcome your suggestions for a better "living" and vibrant Parish Website.
