

THE GREAT SEASON OF LENT

Not everyone might immediately be willing to call the season of Lent great, but there are reasons for doing so. Although Lent calls us to sacrifice and repent, there is something that makes sense about it. It begins with Ash Wednesday (this week) which is a unique day in many ways. It is not a holy day of obligation, but it is one of the most well attended days in the Church year. It taps into an ancient tradition of imposing ashes. If we tried starting a new ritual like this today, most people would reject it. The day seems to naturally identify with all of us for the need to face the darkness and shadow of our lives and strive to change so that we can be better people.

I am very excited about what will happen here at Holy Cross for these days of Lent. We will be using the same theme throughout our Sunday celebrations as well as other prayer opportunities. This theme first came to life last year when most of the Pastoral Team attended the Religious Education Congress in Anaheim, California. It has been slowly growing and taking on new aspects of how it can be incorporated into life here at the parish. There are many helping hands of parishioners who are contributing to this undertaking. We are hopeful that our efforts will make these days deeply prayerful and meaningful for you.

Our theme will be, "Fight My Battles/Surrounded." It is inspired by an uplifting song by the same title written by Elyssa Smith. At first glance, there might be an element of mystery to it. It might take a bit of time to grow on you, but we ask you to take the journey with it. In no way are we trying to promote any sense of violence. We are inviting you to look deep within your own heart and name the issues that you may be struggling with. Is there someone you are struggling to forgive? Do you often beat yourself up with self-doubt, self-hatred, or fear? Do you find yourself becoming an angry person because of what surrounds us in society or politics? Don't let issues like this become a stumbling block to life. There is nothing we will encounter in this life that is stronger than God's ability to transform, heal, and forgive. Believe you have the strength to fight these battles and allow the healing and transforming presence of Christ into your heart.

Enter these days being open to make an interior journey that truly can bring new life. Giving up Hershey bars for 40 days may not be a bad thing, but is it allowing you to know yourself and God in a deeper and more profound way? We want this season to be a great spiritual journey for our parish and for ourselves individually. Enter the journey and experience the Lord.

By the way, happy Valentine's Day as well.

Ashes & Lent

As you may have realized, this coming Wednesday, February 14th, is Ash Wednesday and the start of another Lenten season. As always, the Church will be busy Wednesday distributing ashes, offering services of prayer as together we embark on this penitential season.



You will notice at Mass, the Gloria will not be prayed, nor will we sing the Alleluia verse before the Gospel reading. Purple will adorn the environment of the worship space and a somber approach of music will also be used. It is common to see a liturgical "desert" feeling in Church, eliminating flowers too.

Since Lent is a time of return, repentance, renewal, and preparation, we stand in need of prayer guiding us through our challenges, strengths and hopes. Happily we support, guide, and instruct those preparing to become Catholic or those in need of a Sacrament or two that they might have missed in their youth. We are blessed, here at Holy Cross, to have people coming into the Church this Easter. We keep them in prayer on their journey and welcome them to the family of Faith!

Ash Wednesday is February 14th. Ashes will be distributed at 7 AM, 9 AM Mass, 12 Noon, 4 PM, 5:30 PM & 7 PM.

Children and Ashes...

Our 4 PM and 5:30 PM services will be more "child friendly." These services will be shorter, with a homily geared to a child's understanding. This will enable the children to enter into the spirit of Lent in a manner appropriate for their age.

Fast and Abstinence

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.
