

IN THE SHADOW OF DISNEYLAND

This weekend you will find me in Anaheim, California. I am not alone, but traveling with three members of our Pastoral Team: Tricia, Kelley and Jude. We are attending the annual Religious Education Congress which takes place at the Anaheim Convention Center. Although Disneyland is right next door, there is no time to see Mickey Mouse. This conference first started sixty-seven years ago. It was a simple workshop for those involved in Religious Education in Los Angeles. It has been steadily growing through the decades and has now become a national event and beyond that draws upward of thirty thousand people. Since I have been at Holy Cross, this is the third time I am attending the Congress with Pastoral Team members.

This gathering has always been a font of inspiration, renewal, and new life for me. I try to attend about every three or so years. The keynote speakers and workshops often provide great insight and creativity into various aspects of ministry. The opening ceremony and liturgies are uplifting and inspiring. But perhaps the most energizing part is being surrounded by literally thousands of people who have dedicated themselves to ministry and service to the Church. There is a unique energy to this gathering.

While it is a great time of personal enrichment, Holy Cross has been the recipient of some of the fruits of this conference. Songs like "All are Welcome," "Hold on to Love," "Gracious God," and "Give Us Your Peace" all came to us through those who have been presenters at Congress. Some of my homilies have come from ideas that sprung to life from various presentations. Most recently, my homily on the dualistic mind that I offered on the gospel of the beatitudes was rooted in a talk given at Congress. But for me, the aspect I most want to bring back to Holy Cross is to make the Church alive, vibrant, and life-giving to the people who come here. My understanding of priesthood, ministry and service has, in part, been formed by the days I have spent at this gathering of good and holy people who are committed to our Church. While some may see this as an extravagant weekend away, I see it as an investment in our spiritual future.

I appreciate the expense to the parish in doing a trip like this. I discussed this idea with the Finance Committee in making this year's budget, and they supported the trip. Those who work for the Church are not doing so because of the enormous salaries we pay. I want to affirm the people who work here in their ministry. If what we do is important, if what we do is to make a difference, then it needs to be nurtured. This is a unique opportunity to renew our passion and enthusiasm for our work. And, yes, it is a fun time and a spirit-builder for us. Thank you for your support and understanding as we spend this time away. We'll be back on Monday, but no mouse ears, I promise.





Eat Simply...So Others May Simply Eat

Lent offers us a unique period of time to evaluate our life journey as a follower of Christ. We are encouraged to assess if this journey has led us to an improved understanding and deepening of our relationship with our Lord, with our neighbors and with our brothers and sisters of the world community.



For the last 32 years we at Holy Cross have embraced our Lenten Project **Eat Simply So Others May Simply Eat** as a way to raise our consciousness to the significant needs of our struggling friends. We willingly sacrifice larger or better meals for simpler meals during Lent. Our joint effort to **EAT MORE SIMPLY SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT** unites us in a special way with one another and also with those who are struggling on Long Island.

We encourage you not only to participate in this program, but also to discuss it at the dinner table with your children and family members. Many of us are not consciously aware of the number of people that are struggling and hungry right here in our own area. During 2022, our outreach pantry served an average of 96 people each month.

The Lenten envelopes marked, **EAT SIMPLY...SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT**, will be available throughout the weekends of Lent. We suggest that you place the envelope in a prominent place in your kitchen as a reminder of how you and your family will be uniting yourselves with our struggling neighbors and with the starving of the world. We encourage you to reflect, discuss and to decide how you will eat more basic meals during Lent. Perhaps you have a favorite simple recipe to share. We'd be happy to put it in the bulletin for fellow parishioners to try.

Each weekend or whenever you choose during Lent, you may place your envelope in the basket on the pillar by the altar or in the collection basket. The monies donated will be used to help those who come to Parish Outreach for assistance. We are continually grateful for the very generous response of our parishioners of Holy Cross in donating money, food and supermarket gift cards, which enables us to meet their needs.

LITURGY BYTES

Reconciliation

Since Lent is commonly referred to as a penitential season, let us look at the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Penance or Confession—names that all refer to the same Sacrament. This Sacrament is one of the most unique and beautiful aspects of our Catholic Faith. The Sacrament "washes us clean" and renews us in Christ.



In this Sacrament we meet the loving Jesus who offers us forgiveness. We meet Christ who is eager to absolve and restore us to new life through the priest. The graces of Christ are conferred in the Sacrament by means of visible signs—signs that are acts of worship, symbols of the grace given, and recognizable gestures through which the Lord bestows his gifts. Also, through this Sacrament, the forgiveness of sins and the restoration of grace are the gifts received through the outward sign, that is, the extension of hands and words of absolution pronounced by the priest.

Perhaps this Lent, we could reflect on why we need this Sacrament. Actually, from time to time we need to recognize that we offend God and need to make things right. Like the prodigal son in the gospel, we long to know again the loving embrace of a forgiving father who patiently waits for each of us. We have a certain way available to us to access God's mercy and to know that our sins are forgiven and that is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. There is more to come in future weeks on how this Sacrament evolved and how it is celebrated.

Winter Windfall

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "Winter Windfall." This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.
