

## WHEN LIFE BECOMES SOBERING

These are hard days. We sit in disbelief as we watch the horrific and heartbreaking developments in the Ukraine. There is so much suffering, hardship and injustice. How can a civilized people find ourselves facing such tragedies? Everyone from the youngest of children to the elderly find themselves caught up in something that never should have touched their lives. There is no simple answer. The complexity of politics leaves us feeling helpless and uncertain. We pray for the Spirit to bring wisdom to the hearts of those who are leaders.

I think all of us are dumbfounded as to how the cost of living has skyrocketed in the last two weeks. For many people this is a genuine concern. If the family budget was already tight, dramatic increases in energy and food costs can make life feel scary and filled with uncertainty. There are many who will be feeling financial insecurity as they never experienced before. In addition to these global and national issues, there are some who also carry more personal burdens. Illness, struggles within relationships, and family strife add to the anxiety and challenges of life.

All of this comes as we finally seem to be putting the worst of the pandemic behind us. That is good news. But I think there are many who don't fully realize all the emotional stuff that we are carrying and the healing that needs to take place. We are entering a new wave of difficult times before we fully resolved the last wave that we faced. It's hard to find a point of reference that grounds us and keeps us in balance.

Throughout human history there have always been difficult times. It is one thing to read about them in a history book, but it is another when it becomes part of our daily life. On some level many of us ask, "Didn't we learn lessons from the past to avoid having to deal with these types of things?" But for the moment, these are the issues that are before us. These are not problems just for someone else to resolve, but in some way each of us is called to work our way through them with courage and focus.

While all this is difficult to grapple with, I am not trying to paint a picture of gloom and despair. I do believe there is a rich opportunity for all of us to enter into the Paschal Mystery (the suffering and rising of Christ) in a way that would not happen if everything was fine. We are called to understand Jesus' experience of being in the desert with our own journey. We need to allow the promise of the Risen Lord to bring us life even though it may feel that there is not much reason to be hopeful. We pray that we embrace the Lord at our side bringing strength, courage and hope as we move forward.





## Eat Simply...So Others May Simply Eat

Lent offers us a unique period of time to evaluate our life journey as a follower of Christ. We are encouraged to assess if this journey has led us to an improved understanding and deepening of our relationship with our Lord, with our neighbors, and with our brothers and sisters of the world community.



For the last 31 years, we at Holy Cross have embraced our Lenten Project **Eat Simply So Others May Simply Eat** as a way to raise our consciousness to the significant needs of our struggling friends. We willingly sacrifice larger or better meals for simpler meals during Lent. Our joint effort to **EAT MORE SIMPLY SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT** unites us in a special way with one another and also with those who are struggling on Long Island.

We encourage you not only to participate in this program, but also to discuss it at the dinner table with your children and family members. Many of us are not consciously aware of the number of people that are struggling and hungry right here in our own area. During 2021, our Outreach pantry served an average of 65 people each month.

The Lenten envelopes marked, **EAT SIMPLY...SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT,** will be available throughout the weekends of Lent. We suggest that you place the envelope in a prominent place in your kitchen as a reminder of how you and your family will be uniting yourselves with our struggling neighbors and with the starving of the world. We encourage you to reflect, discuss and to decide how you will eat more basic meals during Lent. Perhaps you have a favorite simple recipe to share. We'd be happy to put it in the bulletin for fellow parishioners to try.

Each weekend, or whenever you choose during Lent, you may place your envelope in the basket on the pillar by the Altar or in the collection basket. The monies donated will be used to help those who come to Parish Outreach for assistance. We are continually grateful for the very generous response of our parishioners of Holy Cross in donating money, food and supermarket gift cards, which enables us to meet their needs.

#### How Can I Help with Emergency Relief for Ukraine?

Catholic Relief Services has supported Caritas Ukraine in its emergency efforts, since the conflict began in 2014, by providing shelter, food and livelihood support for individuals and families displaced and affected by crisis. As the situation worsens, CRS is helping Caritas Ukraine respond to the challenges.



Initial urgent efforts and plans to support displaced families include the following:

- Field kitchens to provide food
- Reception services at Caritas offices, train stations and other locations for displaced families in transit. These will provide information, referrals, food, water, hygiene items and psychosocial support.
- Transportation for displaced families
- Evacuation centers providing shelter and support for displaced families
- Evacuating vulnerable children from centers in conflict areas to centers in safe zones

#### **Long Island Cares Food Drive 2022**

- 1 in 4 adults on Long Island faces food insecurity.
- 41% of food insecure people in Suffolk County are not eligible for nutrition assistance programs.
- From 2019 to 2021, there has been a 63 percent increase in the number of visits to food pantries and other food assistance organizations on Long Island, as a result of COVID-19.
- Over 80,000 children on Long Island face food insecurity.
- Approximately 300,000 people on Long Island receive emergency food each year that is approximately 66,000 people every week.

The elderly make up 4 percent of Long Island's hungry. Seniors are among the hungry for many reasons, including not having enough income to afford nutritious food, suffering from depression and loneliness, or experiencing the side effects from multiple medications which can decrease the desire to eat. Many are too proud to request help.

As we have done for the last few years during Lent and as part of our Baptismal call to live out the Beatitudes, our parish will sponsor a food drive on behalf of Long Island Cares.

Long Island Cares is an organization that collects and delivers food to more than 600 community-based agencies in Nassau and Suffolk. In a typical year, it distributes over 7 million pounds of food.


Please bring your non-perishable food items to Mass on the weekend of March 26th/27th, and place them in the large boxes in the atrium (please no glass).

## Spring Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing, and so, we present the "Spring Cash Fling." This is a similar idea, however it is offered on a quarterly basis.

- Drawing will be held June 1.

Because we anticipate smaller participation, there is a different pay scale:

- This formula was based upon selling 250 tickets @ \$10 each. If more than 250 tickets are sold, the number of prizes will be increased. (In the event the response is strong, we will resume a monthly drawing as soon as possible.)
