FIGHT MY BATTLES/SURROUNDED-Part 5

There are moments when the ministry of the parish takes on enormous challenges. This week was one of those occasions. As many of you may have heard, a young woman of only 16, Valerie Kratochvil, passed away suddenly last week. Her funeral was on Monday. Her mother, father, and twin sister were all devastated by her passing. Many of her classmates from Smithtown East attended the funeral. Almost 400 people filled the church. It seems like an impossible mission when tremendous pain is brought to the door. There is a desperate hope that human insight may shed light into darkness. No words can make sense of such a painful loss. What we can offer is to identify the deepest mystery of our faith, the Paschal Mystery, the dying and rising. We attempt to make the connection of our own journey to that of our Lord. We dare to bridge a great chasm.

One moment that helped to transform the pain of that gathering was when the Smithtown East Chamber Choir offered a Communion meditation song. Angelic voices resonated throughout our Worship Area that helped to move us beyond the pain we were trying to process in our heads. It allowed us a moment of surrendering to prayer in our hearts. That song was a tremendous gift offered to this community by young people who were simply using the gift of their voices that God gave them. It was a rich blessing.

The invitation to Fight our Battles can be more than just a catch phrase. It can open us to the depth and wonder of the Paschal Mystery. There are times when words fail, but yet there is something tangible to be experienced. The presence of God works in amazing ways. It is a humbling experience when we come face to face with that reality.

On the other end of the spectrum, we have three weddings this weekend. I can't remember the last time we had three weddings in one weekend, and especially during Lent. It's another moment when people come to the church to allow the message of faith to be part of defining moments of life. It is a blessing to be able to share in these moments, both the joyful and the sorrowful.

I will not be here for the 11:30 Mass this week. I will be putting on my hat as Dean and visiting St. Patrick's Parish in Smithtown. One of the duties of the Dean is to oversee the installation of a new pastor. Msgr. Brian McNamara took over as Pastor in November, and he is now being formally installed. This seems like a most appropriate celebration on March 17 for St. Patrick's parish. Enjoy your corned beef and cabbage today.

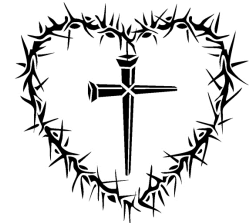

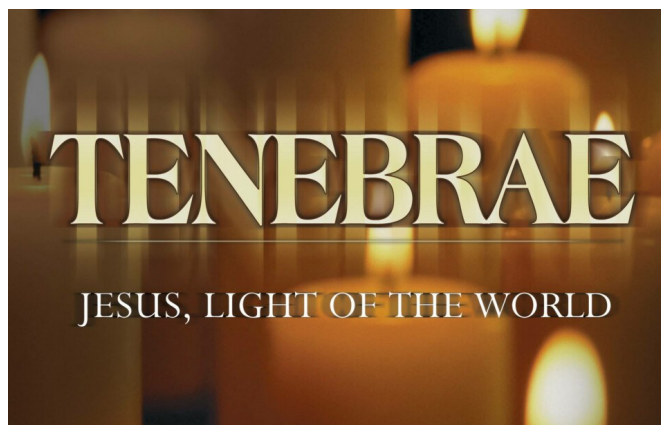

LITURGY BYTES

Jesus Present in the Assembly

First of all, those gathered together for Mass are known as the **assembly**, the Church family that shows us the face of Jesus Christ. Our Church family, with all of its diversity, shows us the face of Christ.



The baby crying during the homily, the elderly man moving slowly with his walker in procession to receive Communion, the teenager slumped over in the rear pew, the mother with three young children moving constantly, and the father rocking a sleeping infant are all part of the Body of Christ as Jesus is present within all.

When we are joined at Mass to pray and sing, as per the gift of our Baptisms, it is something greater than just ourselves alone. We collectively make up the Body of Christ, resurrected, seated at God's right hand, and constantly present whenever we gather in Church to give God praise. This is the beauty of the Sacraments — that we can see and hear and touch God in Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit and the ministry of the Church.

One of the expectations of the Church is that we show reverence to Christ at all times. During Mass, the Church gives reverence to Christ through the use of incense and gestures and bodily postures. We bow to the altar or genuflect to the tabernacle, the dwelling place for the consecrated Body of Christ. We even extend our hand as a gesture of Christ's peace before receiving Holy Communion as another opportunity to show reverence for our Lord present in our brothers and sisters in the assembly and to love one another as ourselves.

This week let us ask God for the grace to see Jesus in one another and to show each other true reverence — something really good to do for Lent!

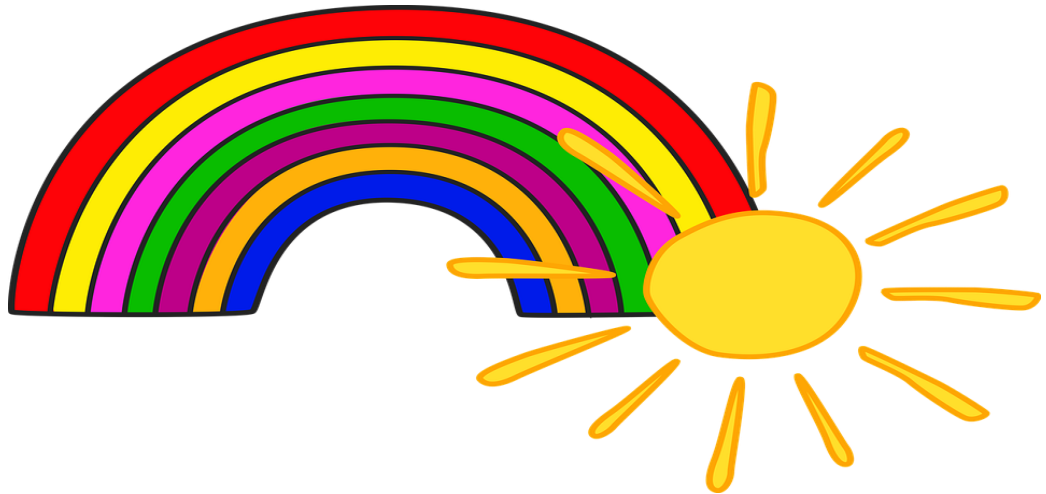

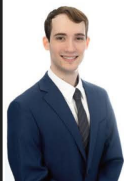

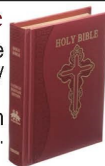
