WE ARE HERE

Don't take for granted that we are able to gather here this weekend to celebrate Mass together. This same weekend two years ago was the first weekend we were grappling with the reality of not being able to have public Masses. We were struggling to figure out the technical issues and sound quality of how to live-stream. It was a challenging and surreal time for everyone, but we all did our best to sort out what needed to be done. In the midst of circumstances none of us could have imagined, we continued to pray as a community. I'm glad all of that is behind us, but it was a defining time in all of our lives.

This past week I was involved in giving a parish mission at St. John the Baptist parish in Wading River. I gave this mission with three of my priest friends: Msgr. Joe DeGrocco, Fr. John Sureau, and Msgr. Jim Vlaun. The first of these missions began in 1996 when we were trying to help out another priest friend, Msgr. Fred Schafer, who was undergoing cancer treatments at the time. Little did we realize, it was the beginning of many of these retreats that we would offer throughout the Diocese. Our little mission team came here to Holy Cross in 2007. This most recent mission last week was likely the final one we would offer. In total, we offered the mission 46 times. As life has moved forward, the time commitment necessary for these retreats has become more and more of a challenge. It has been a great blessing in my priestly ministry, and I am happy I had the opportunity to do this work.

Although I am neither Irish nor Italian, I do enjoy the traditions that go along with the celebration of St. Patrick's and St. Joseph's day. On Thursday I happily sat down to a corned beef and cabbage dinner. I also enjoy the traditional St. Joseph's pastries that can be part of that day's festivities. I am mostly Hungarian, but also German. I can celebrate my German heritage when Oktoberfest rolls around. But, as far as I know, there is no "national goulash day." Oh well, either way I enjoyed the goodies that are associated with the week's celebrations.

On Friday, March 25th, we will once again be able to host a Soup Supper as part of our Lenten offerings. It will be an enjoyable time to share with parishioners. We look forward to welcoming Mr. Robert Cammarata who is our guest speaker. But please let us know if you are coming by using the tear-out in today's bulletin. We are limited in how many people we can accommodate.

We continue to offer our prayers for all those who are suffering in the Ukraine and beyond. Pray for peace.

LITURGY BYTES

The Lord's Prayer



The prayer we call the Lord's Prayer, a/k/a the Our Father, is a very precious gift to us. This Lenten season, let us have the words take root in our hearts in a different or new way.

The prayer's opening, "Our Father," teaches that we can regard God as a loving parent who always desires what is for our good. The "Our" reminds us that we belong to a family of faith. To pray for the coming of God's kingdom and the enactment of God's will calls for a commitment on our part to do God's will.

My question is, how can I pray that God's will be done if I am not willing to obey God's ways? As children, we were taught that by being obedient, we give glory and honor to God. Most of us would recall how we tried to please God, especially as children. This Lent, that thought and the words to this very familiar prayer made me question where I stand.

The petitions in this prayer for daily bread and forgiveness manifest two basic truths: we are dependent completely on God, and we are in need of God's mercy. Both of these also come with the responsibilities of being generous with others and forgiving those who have hurt us.



Eat Simply Ideas


Here are some ideas to consider using for your family's participation in our Eat Simply program.



- If you give up sweets for Lent, donate the money saved so that we can purchase cookies and snacks for a family.

How Can I Help with Emergency Relief for Ukraine?

Catholic Relief Services has supported Caritas Ukraine in its emergency efforts, since the conflict began in 2014, by providing shelter, food and livelihood support for individuals and families displaced and affected by crisis. As the situation worsens, CRS is helping Caritas Ukraine respond to the challenges.



Initial urgent efforts and plans to support displaced families include the following:

- Field kitchens to provide food
- Reception services at Caritas offices, train stations and other locations for displaced families in transit. These will provide information, referrals, food, water, hygiene items and psychosocial support.
- Transportation for displaced families
- Evacuation centers providing shelter and support for displaced families
- Evacuating vulnerable children from centers in conflict areas to centers in safe zones

Parish Outreach sends cards, on behalf of our parish, to those who are ill or hospitalized. Our homebound folks receive friendly telephone calls by Outreach volunteers to keep up the connection and to assess ways the parish can be present to these loved parishioners. At Advent and Easter time a volunteer will visit them and bring a gift from the parish community. Eucharistic Ministers are also available to bring communion to the homebound who desire it.

These are some of the ways Holy Cross reaches out to the homebound and hospitalized. Please help us by contacting Parish Outreach or a member of the Pastoral Team if you know of anyone we can serve in their time of need.

Prayer for Healing Victims of Abuse


God of endless love, ever caring, ever strong, always present, always just:
