# **FIGHT MY BATTLES - Palm Sunday**

The season of Lent is almost completed, and we head into our most solemn days. Liturgically, the Church tries to draw us as deeply as possible into the mystery of the Lord's suffering, death, and resurrection. If we feel that our sacrifices or commitments of Lent were not as prayerful or meaningful as we hoped, that does not disqualify us to enter into the depth of these days. Allow this to be a holy week for you. Continue to bring your "battles" to the Lord to be transformed by his mercy and new life.

In the course of this week, we hear the Passion story told twice, once on Palm Sunday, and again on Good Friday. This is a critical part of Jesus' story. It is depicted in all four gospels. We cannot underestimate the courage, trust and surrender that Jesus demonstrated on the road to Calvary. But it is not just a historical account of what happened to Jesus. It is also an opportunity for us to make a connection between our own suffering and brokenness and that of our Lord. It is not just what one man did; it is the pattern of what all people will do.

Monday of Holy Week in our Diocese has become known as "Confession Monday." Confessions are heard in every church in the Diocese for an extended period of time. It is an opportunity for people to experience God's gift of forgiveness. It is never easy to name the shadow and sin of our lives. When we avail ourselves to this sacrament, we open ourselves to that healing presence of Christ where we need it the most.

When we look at the cross of Jesus, or when we embrace our own sinfulness, we place ourselves on the front line of the battles of our lives. That is never an easy thing to do, but it is an essential part of the Paschal Mystery. But remember, our Lenten theme was not only "fighting battles," it was also about being surrounded. That element is also an integral part of this holy week. We are surrounded by those who share the journey of this life. And we are also surrounded by the very presence of our God.

The celebration of Holy Thursday reminds us of this gift of holy presence. There is a dramatic and humbling element to the evening liturgy that only happens once a year when feet are washed. It is a beautiful gesture of how we are to minister to one another and also how we are to receive from one another. The evening culminates in the celebration of the Last Supper in which the Eucharist was first shared with the disciples. This is a gift that continues to have tremendous power, the very presence of the Lord in the bread and wine. In many ways, this week is a whirlwind. All who we are and all that we believe come together in a profound way. Allow this mystery and gift of the cross to unfold in your hearts.

Join us for Tenebrae on Monday at 7:30PM. Mark your calendar for our Parish Mission, April 21-23, with Fr. Albert Haase, OFM.



# Tenebrae

Is God inviting you?

**Tenebrae** is a candlelight prayer service, held in anticipation of our holiest week. During **Tenebrae** (which means *darkness*), the candles are gradually dimmed as we experience the Passion of Jesus Christ through Scripture readings, meditations, and beautiful music.



We encourage all parishioners to join us for *Tenebrae* on Monday, March 25th, at 7:30 PM as we prepare our hearts and minds for the great gift of *Holy Week*.

# **LITURGY BYTES**

### Holy Week 2024

Holy Week is the most significant week for Catholics spanning from Palm Sunday to Holy Saturday, marking the final days before we celebrate Easter and the Resurrection of Our Lord. During this sacred period, Catholics pray and reflect on the profound journey of Jesus' suffering, sacrifice, and victory over death.



**Palm Sunday** commemorates Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. We receive blessed palms which symbolize the crowd that welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem. At Mass on Palm Sunday, the entire account of the Passion is read. The palms that we receive are usually displayed in our homes, some people weaving them into a cross.

During Holy Week, the Diocese celebrates the Chrism Mass prior to or on Holy Thursday. During the Chrism Mass, the Bishop blesses the oils used for the Sacraments. At this Mass, the renewal of priestly promises also takes place.

*Holy Thursday* begins the first day of the Triduum, the most sacred days of our Faith as Catholics. It begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper, commemorating the Last Supper celebrated by Jesus and his disciples on the Jewish holiday of Passover. During this Mass, the priest will wash the feet of some members of the parish as Jesus washed the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper. It is during the Last Supper that Jesus taught his disciples that the Eucharist is truly His Body and Blood. Jesus taught them the importance of the Eucharist and commanded that they do this in memory of Him. Following the Mass of the Lord's Supper, parishes have Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament.

*Good Friday* commemorates the day Jesus died and saved us from our sins. His death and resurrection on Easter are the most important events of our Faith, and that is why it is called "good." Mass is not celebrated on this day. It is a day of solemn prayer with veneration of the cross and the reading of the Passion.

In the next Liturgy Bytes, we will reflect on Holy Saturday and the great feast of Easter! In the meantime, try to attend at least one of the Holy Week services. You will be glad you did!!
