

This past week was a busy and blessed one at Holy Cross. We are grateful to Mr. Jim Ryan who spent last weekend and three nights with us leading us in a Lenten Mission. The turnout was excellent, averaging 200 people each night. It was an opportunity for us to reflect upon our own attitudes and responses to life. It is too easy to allow our emotions and distractions to get in the way of experiencing the beautiful things of life as well as God's presence. Sometimes simple reminders can ground us and give us a different perspective that is life-giving and joyful. Thank you for all who were part of these evenings.

Jim Ryan stayed with me at the house. In the course of the week he was asking me about different activities that were happening, and he commented how active and engaged our parish community is. He witnessed the Special Needs children gathering for their regular Monday afternoon classes. He saw that we not only had a funeral on Tuesday, but family and friends gathered in our atrium prior to the Mass to spend time with each other. He commented on the Long Island Cares food boxes that were quickly filling with donations. He heard about our gathering to plan the celebrations of Holy Week. Had he stayed until Thursday, he would have seen our choir gathering once again for practice (another piece of pre-Covid life returns). These were a few of the items that filled our calendar this week.

When we are immersed in the routine and business of our lives, we don't always appreciate all that is accomplished. It can be helpful to have an outside set of eyes observing and commenting on the activities that are seen. Holy Cross is blessed that this is the place where good and holy things unfold in the lives of so many people. This good work comes about through many people who give of their time and talent to assist us. It comes about through the generosity of many parishioners who faithfully support us. For many of us, this parish is a spiritual anchor that helps keep the balance of our lives in order. We never want to lose sight of what we have found in this community.



Tenebrae

Is God inviting you?

Tenebrae is a candlelight prayer service, held in anticipation of our holiest week. During Tenebrae, (which means darkness) the candles are gradually dimmed as we experience the Passion of Jesus Christ through Scripture readings, meditations, and beautiful music.



We encourage all parishioners to join us for *Tenebrae* on **Friday, March 31**st, at **7:30 PM**as we prepare our hearts and minds for the great gift of *Holy Week*.



LITURGY BYTES





Now that we are into Lent by five weeks, do you wonder why we no longer sing the "Alleluia" before the Gospel? Actually, the Lenten season is marked by two very distinctive liturgical omissions. Neither the "Gloria" nor the "Alleluia" verse are permitted to be used during the entire 40 days of Lent with a few exceptions. Why?

First of all, the "Gloria" is a hymn that celebrates the coming of the Lord using words from the angels at Christ's birth. The Church during Lent returns in spirit to a time when the people of God were in exile, waiting for the Messiah to come and save them. It is a similar season of expectation as is Advent, but instead of awaiting Christ's birth, Christians await Christ's second *birth* from the tomb on Easter morning.

Secondly, following this same spirit of exile, the Church joins Moses and the Israelites as they wander in the desert for 40 years. It is a time of agony and purification. The word *Alleluia* is rooted in a Hebrew expression that means praise the Lord. We join with the Israelites in saying: "How shall we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land?" (Psalm 137:4) and omit it during the Lenten season.

As a result, the focus for Lent is not one of rejoicing, but mourning the things that prevent us from an authentic relationship with God. Once we make attempts to remove these *things*, through prayer, fasting and almsgiving, we are able to rejoice again at Easter. Afterall, it is only through Christ's resurrection that we celebrate Easter and our own rebirth as sons and daughters of God!



Spring Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "Spring Cash Fling." This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.
