

# THE LENTEN JOURNEY CONTINUES

Chronologically, we are just past the halfway point in our Lenten journey. Mother Nature is giving us mixed signals as we have now entered the spring season. Daffodils are blooming and forsythia buds are waking up, but yet cool air surrounds us, particularly in the early morning. Before long the warmth of spring and the celebration of Easter will coincide. Beyond what is happening outside, we continue to be reminded of the hardship and suffering of the poor people in the Ukraine. Watching the daily news helps keep some of our problems in check as we see those who are affected by the ravages of war.

On Friday the Holy Father consecrated the people of Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This is more than just a symbolic gesture. We pray that our prayers to the Blessed Mother may indeed be a source of peace. Please join us for our monthly Holy Hour next Saturday from 3:45 PM - 4:45 PM in the Worship Area. In the midst of our individual journey during this holy season, we need to hold in our hearts all those who are feeling the pain of war and injustice.

This Wednesday we will have a great spiritual opportunity here at Holy Cross. Creative Ministries will present Journey, Cross, and Crucifixion. This is a prayerful and dramatic performance of the Stations of the Cross. It has been several years since this has been offered here at the parish. I urge you to include this evening of prayer as part of your Lenten journey. I am confident it will be a time of deep prayer. There are no tickets or reservations necessary. Please note that Creative Ministries will take up a collection at the end of the evening to support their ongoing work and ministry. Our own Brian Reich will be playing the keyboard. Bring a friend.

There is no ignoring the significant rise in the cost of living these past weeks. In particular, food and energy costs have thrown many budgets out of balance. In spite of all of this, many are continuing to support us here at Holy Cross. Thank you for your on-going generosity. We are blessed to have many people who have the ability to give to us so that we may continue our work. Because of your generosity our Parish Outreach is in a good position to offer assistance for those who may be struggling at this time.

Thank you also to those of you who have given to the Catholic Ministries Appeal. Our goal this year is almost \$77,000. We already have received pledges of over \$27,000. I appreciate those who are able to support this work of the Church that takes place on the Diocesan level.

# LITURGY BYTES

## Between Palm Sunday and Easter

There is so much that occurs between the above mentioned events that are very moving experiences of importance to us as Catholics. They are solemn and glorious in the same breath – the pinnacle of the liturgical year! It is more sacred than Christmas. This is because Holy Week commemorates the final week of our Lord’s life, the very purpose for which Christmas happened.

The final three days of Holy Week are a separate liturgical season known as the Triduum. The word “triduum” comes from the Latin word meaning three days. Basically, the Triduum is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus’ life on earth, the events of the Passion and Resurrection, when he laid down his life in atonement for our sins. Regarding the Triduum, the US Catholic Conference of Bishops tells us, “Though chronologically three days, it is liturgically **one** day unfolding for us the unity of Christ’s Paschal Mystery.”

The term Paschal Mystery is the ultimate fulfillment of the ancient Jewish Passover which itself was a recollection of how God brought the Jews out of their slavery in Egypt. The spotless lamb was slaughtered at the Passover meal and consumed. That same night the destroying angel “passed over” the homes marked with the blood of the Passover Lamb, and those covered by the blood were saved. This was the Old Testament prefigurement of Jesus’ work at the Last Supper—where he inserted himself as the Paschal Lamb—and Calvary, where the sacrifice was offered to save us from our slavery to

sin. The Paschal Mystery is, therefore, God’s plan of redemption for the fallen human race through the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus. It is one event stretched out over three days. In the next few columns, we’ll reflect on what takes place in Church on each of these three days.

## Eat Simply Recipe

*During this Lenten Season, Eat Simply asks how you and your family will be uniting yourselves with our struggling neighbors and with the starving of the world. We encourage you to reflect, discuss and to decide how you will eat more basic meals during Lent as you participate in Eat Simply.*

What is a “simple meal” in your house? Below is a recipe for a “simple meal” you may wish to try in your home. If you have a favorite “simple” recipe, perhaps you would like to share it, and we would be happy to share it in the bulletin. Thank you so much for participating in the Eat Simply program.

### Linguine Pasta with Shrimp and Tomatoes

#### Ingredients

2 tablespoon olive oil  
3 cloves, garlic, minced  
4 cups diced tomatoes  
1 cup dry white wine  
2 tablespoons butter  
Salt and pepper to taste  
1(16ounce) package linguine pasta  
1 pound peeled and deveined medium shrimp  
1 teaspoon Cajun seasoning  
2 tablespoons olive oil



*Heat the olive oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Stir in garlic and cook for 2 minutes. Add the tomatoes and wine. Bring to a simmer and cook for 30 minutes, stirring frequently. Once the tomatoes have simmered into a sauce, stir in the butter and season with salt and pepper.*

*Fill a large pot with lightly salted water; bring to a rolling boil; stir in the linguine and return to a boil. Cook the pasta uncovered, stirring occasionally, until the pasta has cooked through but is still firm to the bite, about 11 minutes. Drain well in colander set in the sink.*

*Season the shrimp with Cajun seasoning, salt, and pepper. Heat the remaining 2 tablespoons of olive oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Stir in the shrimp and cook until pink on the outside and no longer translucent in the center, about 5 minutes. Stir the shrimp into the pasta sauce, then stir the sauce into the linguine to serve. Enjoy!!!*

# PARISH OUTREACH

## How Can I Help with Emergency Relief for Ukraine?

Catholic Relief Services has supported Caritas Ukraine in its emergency efforts, since the conflict began in 2014, by providing shelter, food and livelihood support for individuals and families displaced and affected by crisis. As the situation worsens, CRS is helping Caritas Ukraine respond to the challenges.



Initial urgent efforts and plans to support displaced families include the following:

- Field kitchens to provide food
- Reception services at Caritas offices, train stations and other locations for displaced families in transit. These will provide information, referrals, food, water, hygiene items and psychosocial support.
- Transportation for displaced families
- Evacuation centers providing shelter and support for displaced families
- Evacuating vulnerable children from centers in conflict areas to centers in safe zones



## Spring Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing, and so, we present the "Spring Cash Fling." This is a similar idea, however it is offered on a quarterly basis.
