

FIGHT MY BATTLES/SURROUNDED #3

We are now three weeks into our Lenten season. I pray our theme is helping you through these holy days. I appreciate that the song we are using is a bit of a risk. It creates an energy level that we don't always incorporate into our prayer. Although, in the coming weeks the same song will take on a different tone and flavor. What we are doing may not appeal to everyone, but I hope it is received as a way of trying to enhance this holy season. I am grateful to our music ministry in working so hard to utilize this song. I am also thankful to the many other helping hands that are contributing to our Lenten theme.


There will be three evenings of prayer offered that will build on this theme. The first one will take place this Wednesday. The first is a prayer evening for the men of the parish. Ladies, don't feel slighted, your evening will take place on March 13. We will then all join together for one final evening on March 20. Some of you may remember that, "way back when," this was a common format for parish missions where the men and women gathered on different evenings. This was an important week for our First Communion children. They received the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time this week. While hearing all those confessions can become a little tedious, it truly is a prayerful and holy moment to share in. It's precious to see when some of the little ones take so seriously what they are doing in asking for God's forgiveness. We have about 110 children who are preparing to come to the altar for the first time in May.

I'm not exactly a bird watcher, but there are times when they catch my attention. This is one of those moments. I don't know if this is mating season for our feathered friends, but several groups are behaving in ways that are hard to ignore. One couple consists of two very small birds, perhaps finches. They fly around in tight little circles as if they were playing follow-the-leader. There is a playful energy to their movement. They limit their movement to one small area, although I cannot find any nests. The others are two large birds, perhaps a hawk of one kind or another. They move from branch to branch and keep a good distance between themselves. They seem to stare at each other for a minute or two then one moves on to a new branch, and the other will follow soon enough to a new vantage point to watch. I tend to only see this in the early morning. I'm surprised they are so active on some of these chilly winter mornings. I'm not sure exactly what is happening, but it is fascinating to watch.

Our Lenten journey continues. May the spirit of "Fight My Battles/Surrounded" help to make these days holy and prayerful.

AN EVENING FOR MEN




Men's Evening of Prayer Wednesday, March 6, @ 7:00PM

Eat Simply Ideas

Here are some ideas to consider using for your family's participation in our Eat Simply program.

- If you give up sweets for Lent, donate the money saved so that we can purchase cookies and snacks for a family.
- Discuss what a "simple meal" means in your household. Is it soup and bread? Is it a peanut butter and jelly sandwich? Our simple meals can be a gourmet feast for some families struggling to make ends meet.

 Rather than having your Starbucks or Dunkin' Donuts coffee, make your morning coffee at home. The money you donate could buy a can of coffee for a family.

- If you are ordering in for dinner, pick up food instead of using Door Dash/Uber Eats. (Many restaurants have curbside pick-up now.) Make a simple homemade dessert for after dinner and donate what it would have cost had you ordered something in.
- Try a plant-based meat alternative. They aren't always a healthier option, but they are gentler on the earth.
- Use the Mercy Meatless Mondays program from the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas to choose alternatives to meat on Mondays and Fridays throughout Lent.

What happens to the kits? Kits are available in the Outreach office to all who would like to participate in becoming a "Sew-Up" or someone who sews the dresses in the comfort of your home. There is no limit to how many dresses you can sew, we just ask that you craft each dress with love and skill.
