# FROM THE MOUNTAINTOP

*by Father Michael*

The Gospel for this weekend is the story of the Transfiguration that takes place on the top of the mountain. Whenever a scripture story takes place on a mountaintop, something significant is going to take place. There is tremendous mystery that surrounds this event, but indeed it was a profound moment for both the disciples and Jesus. Woven into the many details of this story are images of light. We hear about Jesus' face and clothes becoming as white as light. And from what is described as a bright cloud, a message comes forth about the unique relationship Jesus shares with his father.

We used this gospel and image of darkness and light in celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation this past week for 85 of our children who will be celebrating their First Holy Communion in the spring. It is always a joyful time to lead the little ones down the path of faith. While the focus is on the children, it is also a good time to offer a message to the adults. For most of the children, they are nervous and uncertain about what may happen, but in the end they find it a positive experience.

For the four of us from the Pastoral Team who participated in the Religious Education Congress in Anaheim last weekend, we would describe that as a mountaintop experience. (This had nothing to do with being next door to Space Mountain at Disneyland.) The conference was somewhat downsized from previous years, but still there were well over 10,000 participants for this weekend event. Most of the workshops we attended were informative and provided some insights to our ministries. But for all of us, the richness of the days were experienced in the Masses and prayer gatherings. It is hard to imagine how an arena that is mostly used for sporting events and concerts can become a sacred place for prayer. There were decorations that enhanced the appearance of the vast space. But it truly was the presence of so many people committed to their ministry, the Church, and the Lord that brought the place to abundant life.

For us who minister here at Holy Cross, we embrace that we have been called to serve this community. It is our mission to allow the power and presence of Christ to be experienced here through our different ministries. It was a beautiful gift to be the recipient of these rich moments in prayer and presence. It renews our desire to bring moments like that to Holy Cross.

Continue to allow these days of Lent to be a sacred and prayerful time for you. You need not have to climb a mountain or fly to the West Coast to experience a moment of grace. But you may need to seek some quiet time and put aside unnecessary distractions. May you come to know the peace and life of our Lord.

**The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be offered after the 9:30 Mass this weekend.**



# PARISH OUTREACH

## *Eat Simply...So Others May Simply Eat*



Lent offers us a unique period of time to evaluate our life journey as a follower of Christ. We are encouraged to assess if this journey has led us to an improved understanding and deepening of our relationship with our Lord, with our neighbors and with our brothers and sisters of the world community.

For the last 32 years we at Holy Cross have embraced our Lenten Project **Eat Simply So Others May Simply Eat** as a way to raise our consciousness to the significant needs of our struggling friends. We willingly sacrifice larger or better meals for simpler meals during Lent. Our joint effort to **EAT MORE SIMPLY SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT** unites us in a special way with one another and also with those who are struggling on Long Island.

**We encourage you not only to participate in this program, but also to discuss it at the dinner table with your children and family members.** Many of us are not consciously aware of the number of people that are struggling and hungry right here in our own area. **During 2022, our Outreach pantry served an average of 96 people each month.**

The Lenten envelopes marked, **EAT SIMPLY...SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT**, will be available throughout the weekends of Lent. We suggest that you place the envelope in a prominent place in your kitchen as a reminder of how you and your family will be uniting yourselves with our struggling neighbors and with the starving of the world. *We encourage you to reflect, discuss and to decide how you will eat more basic meals during Lent.* Perhaps you have a favorite simple recipe to share. We'd be happy to put it in the bulletin for fellow parishioners to try.

**Each weekend or whenever you choose during Lent, you may place your envelope in the basket on the pillar by the altar or in the collection basket.** The monies donated will be used to help those who come to Parish Outreach for assistance. We are continually grateful for the very generous response of our parishioners of Holy Cross in donating money, food and supermarket gift cards, which enables us to meet their needs.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

In our Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent, Saint Matthew tells us that before Jesus began His public ministry, He was “led by the Spirit into the desert” (*Mt. 4:1*), where He prayed, fasted, and gave Himself over to a life of Gospel poverty. Lent is the sacred time in which, following the example of Jesus, we are led by the same Holy Spirit into the solitude of the desert to deepen our relationship with the Father and purify our hearts to become like the Son. The Spirit that draws each of us into this period of preparation does so through the practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These three pillars of Lenten observance call us away from the selfishness of sin and lead us to a deeply personal encounter with Jesus Christ.

Recognizing that many have never experienced this personal relationship with Jesus, the Holy Spirit has led our local Church to embark on a period of Eucharistic Revival—a movement aimed at leading many to encounter Jesus by restoring understanding and devotion to the great mystery of the Eucharist. Following the Spirit’s desire to rekindle Eucharistic amazement in our hearts, let us reflect on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as practices deeply rooted in devotion to the Body and Blood of Jesus.

The Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church, the “source and summit of the Christian life” (*CCC 1324*). Lenten prayer focused on the Eucharist calls us to rediscover the Catholic practice of praying the Mass by offering our intentions, work, hardships, and family life as “spiritual sacrifices” united to the priest’s offering of the Lord’s Body (*Lumen Gentium, 34*). In this way the great prayer of the Church becomes the great prayer of our lives: the summit to which all our daily sacrifices are directed and the source from which graces flow into everyday life.


Prayerfully receiving the Eucharist not only requires bodily fasting from food but also spiritual fasting from worldly attachments that keep us from communion with God. At prayer in the desert, Christ rejects the temptations of Satan by reciting a scripture verse from Deuteronomy 8:3, “One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.” The Lord recognizes that bodily fasting becomes a prayer only when it moves us to cling to God’s Word. This Lent may we take time to prepare for the Sunday Eucharist not only by fasting, but also by meditating on the weekly scriptures.

In the second century, Saint Justin Martyr wrote one of the earliest accounts of the celebration of the Sunday Eucharist. He recounts that after the breaking of the bread, the early Christians would be moved to give alms and “take care of all who are in need” (*First Apology, 67*). The Church has always recognized an inseparable bond between the sacrifice of the Mass and the sacrifice of almsgiving. Saint John Chrysostom even understood almsgiving as a Eucharistic action. He described the poor person as an “altar” where one could encounter the Body of Christ and offer everywhere a daily sacrifice (*Homily 20 on Second Corinthians*). As we remember the sacrifice of Christ at each Sunday Eucharist, may we always remember the poor.

Christ entered the desert for 40 days to prepare for the mission ahead of Him. Following the Lord’s example, we enter the Lenten desert of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving with the goal of becoming Eucharistic missionaries. The Holy Spirit is leading each of us to a personal encounter with the Lord and calling us to pray and fast for the conversion of many hearts during this grace-filled moment of Eucharistic Revival.

Let us follow the Spirit’s guidance with open hearts ready to receive the Lord; and may the heart of Jesus, in the Most Blessed Sacrament, be praised, adored, and loved with grateful affection, at every moment, in all the tabernacles of the world, even to the end of time.

## Spring Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the “*Spring Cash Fling*.” This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.
