

HOLY PLACES:

A Packed Church and an Empty Chapel

Holy Week and Easter unfolded beautifully here at the parish. I am grateful to all those who lent a helping hand in doing all that is necessary with our many celebrations. The attendance numbers were strong for all the services and Masses. Clearly, the most crowded moment was at the 11:30 Mass. We counted just shy of 700 in the building! The last time we would have had a number like that was Christmas of 2019. It was exhilarating to see so many people.

It was a life-giving celebration. The prayers, readings and songs all proclaimed the glory and wonder of the Risen Lord. While all this was happening, I had a sense that all the folks there were hungering for this message. There was a desire to share in the telling of this great story, and there was a desire to do so in the presence of so many others. There was an energy and life that was found in the sheer numbers of those who were there.

Contrasting that, this week I had the opportunity to visit a parishioner at the Maria Regina Rehab Center and Nursing Home in Brentwood. This facility on the grounds of the Sisters of St. Joseph's mother house was originally their own little retirement home to care for the sisters of their community. A number of years back, they made a wise decision to expand the scope of the services offered. They went through a lengthy process to meet all the State requirements to operate as a licensed facility to provide long-term care as well as rehabilitation. They continue to serve the retired sisters as well as provide for others.

I had a delightful visit with one of our parishioners. Before I left, I stopped in the chapel to say a prayer. I was the only one there. No sooner had I sat down that I had an overwhelming feeling of being enveloped in holiness. The chapel itself is nice enough, it was built during the 70s, and its art and architecture reflect that time period. But my feeling had little to do with stained glass or the décor of the building. It was a sense that I was in a place that was the spiritual home for countless holy women. I can't imagine how many hours of prayer have been offered within those walls through the decades. I said a prayer for the sisters both living and deceased, and I asked them to pray for me. It was a moment I felt deeply connected to people who I did not necessarily know. God's presence was abounding even in the midst of an empty chapel.

These are days when our faith urges us to share in the joy of the Risen Lord. At times, that joy is found in vast numbers and at other times, in quiet and serenity. May we continue to rejoice in new life wherever we may find it.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will take place after the 9:30 Mass on Sunday, May 1st.

Are you a baptized Catholic who has not celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation?



LITURGY BYTES

Divine Mercy Sunday



Every year on the week after Easter, the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday. During the 20th century (in the mid 1930s) when the need for God began to diminish along with the dignity of human life, a Polish nun, Sister Faustina, received private revelations concerning Divine Mercy from Jesus. In May of 2000, five days after Sister Faustina was canonized a saint, the Vatican decreed that the second Sunday of Easter would be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

The chaplet was also given to St. Faustina as was recorded in her diary. Jesus desired that His mercy be known throughout the whole world and encouraged St. Faustina to spread this prayer with the 9 intentions He gave to her.

Familiar to us is the Rosary which is possible to use in order to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Here is an overview of how it is done with the Rosary:

Holding the rosary in your hands, **make the sign of the cross**. Using the first three beads say the Creed, the Our Father and a Hail Mary.

Then on the next bead where we say the Our Father, instead say:

“Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, soul and divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.”

On all the beads where we normally say the Hail Mary, we say the following:

“For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.”

(We repeat this pattern throughout the five decades of the rosary.)

At the conclusion, we pray this prayer three times:

“Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.”



Eucharistic Revival Movement Outlined by the Bishops of the United States

Preserving Religious Freedom for all, "In 2021 the U.S. Supreme Court granted a historic ruling (Tandon v. Newsom), ensuring the constitutional right to worship for all Americans." (1) This was yet another ruling meant to protect the foundational right to religious liberty in America and will ensure freedom for all churches to join the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) plans for "Eucharistic Revival."

"In a spiritual sense, 'Revival' means coming to life, an awakening as the mighty Spirit of God that brings new life to His Body, the Church, and to us as individuals who are part of that grand fellowship. It means a stirring of our hearts to the very core of our being - which results in joy," wrote Guidelines.org.(2)

In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing, and so, we present the "Spring Cash Fling."
