

As I write this article, I'm still feeling the exhilaration, joy, and a bit of exhaustion from all the festivities of Holy Week and Easter. The crowds on Sunday were amazing, culminating in over 800 people at the 11:30 Mass. We were packed to the rafters. I will never grumble about those who come only a few times in the year. I am grateful to have moments like that where the Gospel can be preached to so many. I am committed to offer the very best we can to those who come here to Holy Cross to share in our worship, but especially on our most holy days. A liturgy is a work of art, and it takes the efforts of many to bring out its full beauty. While we can always use more helping hands, I am most grateful to all those who helped our Masses to be a joyful and inspiring experience.

I don't want to sound boastful, but our Lenten theme seems to have touched the hearts of many. Numerous people have reached out to me in different ways to express their gratitude for what was a challenging, but meaningful season. When the Spirit comes alive in people's hearts, it is an exciting moment. It is most humbling to realize you may have played a role in someone experiencing the power of Christ in their lives. Spoken word, song, environment, and a prayerful presence help foster moments of grace. Thank you to all who were part of these days.

Although the numbers were impressive, it looks like our collection will be lower than it was last year by about \$4,000. Some Easter money will still trickle in over the next few weeks, so we have not hit the total button yet but it does look lower. We have been trying our best to get a functioning Venmo account. We placed a QR code for that along with our website on a special card in all the pews. This form of payment is preferred by many younger people, and we want to be able to offer it as an option. We thought everything was resolved, but at some point during the weekend the account was shut down. It seems having a Venmo account connected to a non-profit organization has more complications than a regular account. We will go back to the drawing board, but it is a frustrating process. There is far more to our holiest days than finances. But it is a part of the picture of our community. Our budget is on a razor-thin line, and we don't want money concerns to impact our work. Thank you to all who gave so generously.

I hope we have a clear day on Monday for the eclipse. I don't plan on traveling to Cleveland or one of those places where there will be complete darkness, but I still hope to experience some of it here.

May the joy of this holy season continue to unfold in your heart. Easter is more than a day. It can truly be a source of life for us as we face the challenges that are before us.



LITURGY BYTES

The Great 50 Days!

The great 50 days begin with our celebration of Easter and run until Pentecost. It actually is celebrated as one long feast. This is similar to the Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday which consists of one liturgy that spans three days. Let us also remember



that Easter is not over on Easter Monday. It takes 50 days to celebrate Easter. All of the Sundays of the Easter season are part of the Easter story. We call these feasts "solemnities." Two significant feasts during the Easter season are the Ascension which is 40 days after Easter, and at the end of the Easter season is the great feast of Pentecost which is the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the Church. There are various elements and themes of the Easter season. The Easter Vigil is the primary and principal Mass of the Easter celebration. However, on Easter Sunday itself we look back at the Vigil, renew our baptismal promises, and truly experience a joyful celebration of praise and thanks for Christ's death and resurrection.

The Scripture readings for the season of Easter are all from the New Testament or Christian Scriptures. The first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles, which is about the first emerging Christian community that was charged with spreading the Good News. During the Easter season we hear the stories of Jesus' post resurrection appearances: Jesus' appearance to the Apostles, the doubting Thomas story, the road to Emmaus and Jesus' appearance at the Sea of Tiberius. Also, we hear the famous encounter with Peter and Jesus' question to him, "Do you love me?," as well as Jesus' command to Peter to feed his sheep. The pronouncement by Jesus that he is the Good Shepherd and that he is the vine, and his disciples are the branches is also heard. Finally, Jesus tells his disciples that he will send the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, to continue his presence on earth. These are all familiar accounts but should be heard anew each year.

These great 50 days are also a special time for the "new" Catholics of our parish. They are invited to uncover the mysteries of our faith, referred to as mystagogy, during this fascinating time. Next week, we will examine all that this time holds.




