HAPPY MAY

For the last few weeks, my articles have been more of a spiritual nature. Allow me to update you with more practical news about life in Holy Cross.

As you know, I have been planning to move the tabernacle to the sanctuary as well as install a statue of the Holy Family in the chapel where the tabernacle currently stands. I had received word that the statue would be ready for shipping by mid-May. Unfortunately, these days shipping has become very complicated (our shipment will be coming from Asia). Now we are expecting delivery by the end of August, which is about three months longer than I was told it would take. We will schedule the movement of the tabernacle in conjunction with the arrival of the statue.

After many discussions and getting input from parishioners, I have decided on where the tabernacle will be placed. It will be against the glass wall of the sanctuary, to the right of the main center beam and to the left of where the credence table currently sits. This will necessitate moving the credence table, and we will need to tweak some of what the altar servers do. These issues will be addressed as we move closer to the actual movement. Most parishioners support the idea of moving the tabernacle, but there was a diversity of opinions on where it should be located. I pray that this change is agreeable to all.

This afternoon (Sunday), we will have our parish gathering for the Synod. The Holy Father has called for a universal Synod process so that the people of God may have input into the life of the Church. There will be a discussion of how the Church embraces ideals such as communion, participation, and mission. There is value in our spending time in speaking and listening to one another.

Thank you to all who have pledged or given to the Catholic Ministries Appeal. Parishioners have generously pledged over \$33,000. If we were to achieve our goal, which is \$76,700 the parish would receive a substantial rebate. I realize that for many, the household budget is even tighter than usual due to high energy and food costs. I am grateful to those who are able to help the ministries that are supported by the Appeal. I appreciate your prayerful consideration if you are able to support this effort.

This week we turned on one of the outdoor spigots, and water cascaded out from behind the wall. We had a broken pipe. A visit from our friendly plumber and \$510.24 later, we are back in business—high and dry.

Happy May! The warmth of spring will soon be upon us.

LITURGY BYTES

The Great 50 Days!



Isn't it exciting and so joyful every year when we finally get to Easter? I am sure the first disciples felt that way with Christ's Resurrection, too. It is also the same joy you see on the faces of the newly baptized at the Easter Vigil. This year I saw that same radiant joy, via pictures on Facebook, of a young man I knew from my grandson's hockey team who was received into the Church this year. It is a joy that cannot be contained in just a moment. That is why from about the third century, the Church let Easter last into a 50-day season from Easter Sunday to Pentecost.

Our ancestors found great symbolic meaning in these 50 days of Easter, for example, 50 days in seven weeks—a week of weeks plus one day. That extra day was the Eighth Day, the same name they gave to Sunday—the day of resurrection, the day that symbolized eternity. It is not just the start of a new seven-day week but the beginning of a whole new creation. Fifty days are also just about one-seventh of the entire year, so these 50 days hold the same relationship to the year as Sunday does to the week. That is why the 50 days of Easter are known as the Great Sunday of the entire year.

While 50 days of immense joy seem hard for us to sustain today, the season still has meaning. It is the time when we are meant to experience what it means when we say Christ is risen. It is the season when we hear and ponder the beginnings of our Church, the gifts of the Spirit, and the meaning and mission of discipleship, on what joining in the Eucharist commits us to be and do. Eventually we do move out of this celebratory mood and move on. However, let us try to live out what we have celebrated *in all moments of our lives*. Let us keep wishing everyone: **HAPPY EASTER!**

Who is Eligible for a Call?



Would you like to receive a call from a parishioner volunteer while you are homebound? Individuals may self refer or be referred by a caregiver or family member. This program is intended to serve seniors/parishioners who are homebound, living alone or otherwise need regular contact to eliminate social isolation.
