HAPPY SUMMER

I always see the summer as a time to relax a bit and re-energize. I hope that you, too, look forward to enjoying this time of year. In that spirit, I am taking one of my vacation weeks. I am in one of my favorite corners of the world—Tucson, Arizona. It's a real pretty spot, but I have to say my timing in going there at this time of year is not the best. Well, at least they say it is a dry heat.

This weekend the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally called Corpus Christi Sunday. This feast day will always have a special place in my heart as it was the first Mass I celebrated as a newly ordained priest. It was a humbling experience to realize that something as precious as the responsibility of celebrating the Eucharist that has been handed down for so many years, was now being handed to me. Sharing in the Eucharist is a profound experience of union with our Lord. As the challenges of life around us increase, the power and significance of the Eucharist can increase. May we allow this gift to form, empower and guide our lives.

A burger on the grill, the company of fellow parishioners, and hopefully good weather will make for a delightful evening. I hope you can make it. Also, it is the last day to sign up for Holy Cross Day with the Long Island Ducks. The ticket includes an all you can eat BBQ and a seat for the game. It should be a fun day for those who can participate.

Put out the welcome mat for summer. Come up with your list of things you want to do. Use well this season to spruce up the yard, have a BBQ or two, and enjoy the lazy days of summer.

LITURGY BYTES

Corpus Christi



This weekend the Church celebrates the feast of Corpus Christi or the Body of Christ. As Christians, we are called to share in Christ's life and sacrifice. God becoming human in Christ was the beginning of a life devoted to others. Today we focus exclusively on the Eucharist. We rejoice and celebrate this great gift which is the very center and heart of the Church, the center and heart of our faith, and the center and heart of parish life and the lives of each of us.

The first reading shows hospitality of food and drink, sharing a meal which unites guest and host in bonds like family ties. In the second reading, St. Paul instructs the community at Corinth who are struggling and having internal divisions on the meaning of the Lord's Supper. He connects the Last Supper with the death of Jesus who gave his life for others. The words "do this in remembrance of me" instruct us to imitate Jesus in giving life to and for others. In the Gospel, a very familiar passage instructs the Apostles to help prepare for the meal by assisting Jesus, the host. Notice the familiar Eucharistic formula referenced here. The familiar words—took, blessed, broke, gave—show us the meaning of meals with Jesus.

When we partake of the Eucharist at Communion, we partake of life itself. We unite ourselves to divinity through Jesus' humanity. Transubstantiation is the name we give to the bread and the wine changing. The substance is transformed while maintaining its external appearance of bread and wine. This is an act of faith on the part of Catholics. Remember, St. Paul says, "in the Christian life we go by faith and not by sight." We need to be humble and open to God performing a miracle every day in this Church, the miracle of the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the greatest gift of God's love for each of us.

So, on this feast of Corpus Christi, it is clear we celebrate God's greatest gift to us—himself in Holy Communion, and we also celebrate each other as joined members of the body of Christ. Go forth strengthened to do the work of God!





Friendly Calls

What are Friendly Calls?

Friendly calls provide a simple check-in and friendly phone call to seniors/parishioners who are homebound, feeling lonely and/or isolated. This program helps seniors/parishioners who are trying to remain independent with phone calls during the week to check on their mental, spiritual, and physical wellbeing. Getting regular friendly calls can be a real boost for someone who is lonely.

Your concern, time and compassion are the foundation of this program. Do you have a few minutes a week to share a conversation with a senior/parishioner who may be homebound and feeling isolated? If yes, please call the Outreach office at 631-265-2200 x113 to become a volunteer. All volunteers must be VIRTUS certified and sign a confidentiality form.

Who is Eligible for a Call?



Would you like to receive a call from a parishioner volunteer while you are homebound? Individuals may self refer or be referred by a caregiver or family member. This program is intended to serve seniors/parishioners who are homebound, living alone or otherwise need regular contact to eliminate social isolation. 


