LITURGY BYTES

Symbols in Confirmation

Water, oil and light are tangible signs that tell us something for which words can provide only the barest outline – that God is genuinely with us. We touched on some of these symbols last week in our look at some of the symbols used in the Sacrament of Baptism. This week it's on to the Sacrament that reaffirms Baptism which is Confirmation.



Receive the Holy Spirit.

God is here as the hymn "Gather Us In" assures us. What meets our senses makes God present to us. The familiar smell of incense, candles, the warmth of hugs and handshakes, fragrance of flowers adorning the sanctuary are most of what we missed when we were in shutdown mode during the pandemic quarantine last year. Let us look at some familiar symbols, perhaps taken for granted, and find a new meaning!

In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the symbols that are outstanding, in my humble opinion, are the laying on of hands, the anointing with the Sacred Chrism and the confirming prayer. Confirmation reaffirms our Baptism, strengthening our experience of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, already received at the time of our Baptism, but now taking on a more deeper meaning, as we are anointed with the Sacred Chrism.

At Confirmation, we hear in Scripture the account of the coming of the Holy Spirit from the Acts of the Apostles as it happened to them and Mary in the upper room on Pentecost. In preparing candidates for this Sacrament, we reassure them this second coming of the Holy Spirit will not be as dramatic as the Pentecost story. However, once confirmed we are more aware of the gifts working in our lives. The anointing with the Sacred Chrism, sealing us with the gifts of the Spirit, leaves a special mark on each candidate as does the Confirmation prayer when the calling of the Holy Spirit, known as the "epiclesis," is prayed over the candidates. These are profound moments as one is confirmed because of what these symbols represent and how they impact us. Candidates either reaffirm their baptismal name or add another name for Confirmation. We see evidence of this in Scripture: Simon became Peter, Levi became Matthew, Saul became Paul, to name just a few, when their relationship with God changed quite a bit. This also happens with Confirmation – our relationship with God takes on a new meaning!

As our young people are completing their preparation for Confirmation here at Holy Cross this fall, let us keep them in our prayers that they embrace the graces from this important day in their lives.

BACKGROUND SCREENING UPDATE

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5-year intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

- 1. Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: <u>www.Virtus.org</u>
- 2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct provided during the Virtus registration process.
- 3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened, you may be at—or beyond—the **5yr. rescreening requirement**. If this is the case, you will receive an email from **Sterling Volunteers** asking you to complete the background screening application online. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. **Please be aware—this is not a scam nor has your email been hacked.** The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically re-sign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Edit Your Virtus Account:

To access your Virtus account <u>www.Virtus.org</u> you will need your Username and Password. If you need assistance, please contact Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 or <u>helpdesk@virtus.org</u>. Once in your account, review your account information—particularly your email address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen, in the green column, click "Update My Account." You will be able to make the necessary changes. Please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.

Summer Cash Sizzle

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to Covid. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "*Summer Cash Sizzle*." RELIGIOUS FREEDOM



U.S. Catholic Bishops Designate Religious Freedom Week: June 22-29

Each year, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) observes Religious Freedom Week. It begins on June 22, the feast day of SS Thomas More and John Fisher, two English martyrs who fought religious persecution in the early 16th century. The week includes the Nativity of St. John the Baptist on June 24 and ends on June 29, the feast of SS Peter and Paul, two apostles martyred in Rome.

The theme chosen for this year is *Solidarity in Freedom*. "Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community." ⁽¹⁾

The Bishops invite all "to pray, reflect and act to promote religious freedom." ⁽²⁾ The USCCB offers resources for each day focusing on different areas of religious freedom at



Happening Now: A Victory! 2nd Grader Will be Allowed to Read Bible During Recess

A second grader in Illinois who liked to sometimes read her Bible both silently and aloud during recess had it taken away when her teacher said, "You can't be doing that."⁽³⁾ Her parents reached out to American Center for Law & Justice (ACLJ) who wrote a letter to the district explaining a Supreme Court ruling that "students do not shed their constitutional rights at the schoolhouse gates..." ⁽⁴⁾ "We're happy to report that after reading our letter, the school thanked us for educating them and removed all restrictions on Gabrielles's reading," the ACLJ reported. ⁽⁵⁾
