

THE TIDES OF CHANGE

This is a time of year that often marks changes. It is certainly true in the academic world, and it is also true within the life of the Church. Allow me to share with you a few changes that will be happening here at Holy Cross.

Our Parish Outreach has reduced its hours to three days a week. While we continue to serve those in need and reach out to seek those who may need assistance, the requests for help have gone down over the past few months. The hours of Outreach will change seasonally as demands increase. We anticipate going back to four days a week in the autumn when planning for Thanksgiving and Christmas takes place, but for the time being the Outreach Office is open Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday.

At some point during the summer, we will modify hours in the Parish Office. On Fridays our hours will become 9:00–12:00. Friday afternoons tend to be very quiet, and we don't anticipate any inconvenience in adopting these new hours throughout the year.

For the past five years Tricia Clarke has served as our Director of Religious Education. She has done a marvelous job in maintaining the operation of the program as well as offering her creativity and energy in expanding opportunities for our families. Tricia has decided that it is time for her to begin the next chapter of her professional life, and she will be leaving the office at the conclusion of our Vacation Bible School. She will remain an active parishioner continuing in many of the ministries she now serves. We will miss her enthusiasm and her ability to work with our families. Her formal thank-you will take place in July.

Tricia's leaving leaves an absence in an important role in the life of the parish. We are happy to welcome Mrs. Jennifer Miller who will be taking on the role of coordinating Religious Education. Jennifer has been a parishioner for four years and volunteers as a catechist. She is a familiar face as she is a lector as well as helps with the slides for HCTV. Jennifer is excited about the opportunity to take on this role. We feel her personality and gifts make this a good fit for the parish. It will take time to adjust to the many responsibilities, but we are confident she will do an outstanding job. Welcome, Jennifer!

One final note. This June begins what will likely be my final year here at Holy Cross as Pastor. The current policy in this diocese is priests are given up to 2 six-year terms as pastor. I came to Holy Cross in June of 2013, and so my time will conclude in June of 2025. The nature of Diocesan priesthood and parish life means there are always changes. With change comes a whirlwind of emotion. A parish is never defined by any one person, but rather a multitude of people working in cooperation with the Spirit. That Spirit will continue to be at work in our parish as we move forward.



Serving Our Church Family

Did you ever think about having a more active part in the Mass? One of the special gifts we have as baptized Catholics is to serve Our Lord to our sisters and brothers at Mass. Those in this ministry are known as Ministers of Holy Communion, a/k/a EMs (Eucharistic Ministers). It is a privilege to



It might also be helpful to speak to one of the EMs you see serving at Mass to ask personally about this ministry. After Mass you will find them helping to clean the vessels used at Mass in the small Sacristy next to the Chapel. I know they would be delighted to speak with you and answer your questions. It is also good to pray about it—ask God to guide you and give you strength to take the next step. Once you feel it is something to pursue, you will need to speak with Fr. Michael. He will submit your name to the Bishop's office. You will then choose your training date and location from the information that I will give you.

After the Diocesan training, you will receive a card stating you are a Minister of Holy Communion for the Parish of the Holy Cross. It is suggested that you carry this with you. I will arrange for you to have a short Holy Cross training with one of our veterans, and your contact information along with your Mass of Preference to serve will be added to the Parish's EM list. Also, there is a small commissioning prayer that Fr. Michael will offer for you at the first Mass you will serve at. The schedule is done on a two-month basis with copies available on the website or at the Parish Office. We gather for ministry meetings and have special guest speakers during the year for support and community.

Please consider responding to your baptism to live as an active member. You will not regret the privilege of bringing Jesus to others.





Unfortunately for many families, summer can mean months of worry and hunger as kids lose access to healthy meals given at school. Food insecurity is real on Long Island. As parents juggle the ongoing rising costs at the supermarket, gas pumps, housing, utilities and medical co-pays, they turn to the Parish Outreach to find relief.
