AND SO, ANOTHER YEAR BEGINS

by Father Michael

This Saturday marks the 34th Anniversary of my doing this priesthood stuff. As so many of us often remark about life, “Where has the time gone?” Through the years I have been given the privilege of serving twenty-seven years in different parishes and seven years as chaplain in a high school. It has been an amazing journey, and I am blessed for the opportunities I have been afforded.

I think back fondly to the days that surrounded my ordination and first Mass. I remember so many people were excited and made great efforts to be present. For some family and friends, this was their first encounter with a celebration like this. They were caught up in the wonder and mystery of the traditions and the ritual. Actions like being called by name, laying prostrate on the floor for the litany of the saints, the laying on of hands, first blessings were all pieces to a mosaic that many had not experienced before. Even being present in the Cathedral added to the richness of the day. I look back at all these moments with a tremendous sense of joy.

At that point in life, my entire life had pretty much been as a student: high school, college, and the seminary. I remember being tired of school and wanting to get started, but I also felt so uncertain about actually doing the work of a priest. While I had the basic foundation that was needed, the real formation of my priesthood came to life as I began to live it. I’m grateful to the many people who showed patience and understanding as I grew in understanding my role. Regardless of where I was assigned, it was always the people who mostly defined the experience. It is only within the context of community that the Spirit has space to come to life.


As the calendar unfolds, there are years when Pentecost has fallen on the same weekend as my anniversary. This year is one of those occasions. I like when the two coincide. Of all the liturgical celebrations in the course of the year, Pentecost is the one that most celebrates the Spirit alive within a particular community. It affords an opportunity to recognize the many ministries that are exercised within the life of Holy Cross as well as the wider Church. But more importantly, it affirms the relationships that are woven into the life of this parish.

This is a wonderful opportunity for us to offer thanks for the life that this community brings. May we be a people who continue to journey and grow together. I am deeply grateful for the opportunity to live and minister here at Holy Cross. It is a place of many blessings.

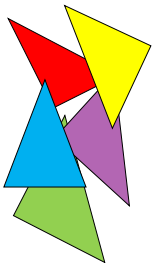

Friendly Calls

What are Friendly Calls?

Friendly calls provide a simple check-in and friendly phone call to seniors/parishioners who are homebound, feeling lonely and/or isolated. This program helps seniors/parishioners who are trying to remain independent with phone calls during the week to check on their mental, spiritual, and physical wellbeing. Getting regular friendly calls can be a real boost for someone who is lonely.

Your concern, time and compassion are the foundation of this program. Do you have a few minutes a week to share a conversation with a senior/parishioner who may be homebound and feeling isolated? If yes, please call the Outreach office at 631-265-2200 x113 to become a volunteer. All volunteers must be VIRTUS certified and sign a confidentiality form.

Who is Eligible for a Call?



Would you like to receive a call from a parishioner volunteer while you are homebound? Individuals may self refer or be referred by a caregiver or family member. This program is intended to serve seniors/parishioners who are homebound, living alone or otherwise need regular contact to eliminate social isolation. If you are interested in receiving a call, please call Outreach at 631-265-2200 x113. All calls are confidential.
