

Normally, the summer months bring slower life and activity. While that is still partially true, there is an abundance of events that are taking place these days. I just finished a bit of a marriage marathon. I think I had nine weddings between April and last weekend. While that is not a staggering number, it is the most weddings Holy Cross has seen during that span of time in many years.

Happily, next week our Vacation Bible School (VBS) once again comes to life. 2019 was the last time we were able to offer it. We look forward to welcoming about 60 campers and almost as many young people who assist in running the program. There are so many helping hands in a program like this. We are grateful for those who give of their time and talent to assist. On a practical level, there are a few things to note about parish life while VBS is taking place. Morning Mass will take place during the days of VBS. However, Mass will be at 8:00 AM and will be held in the Chapel. For security reasons, all the doors to the building will be locked once the children arrive. If you come to the office during the morning you may need to wait outside until you can be escorted to the office. The Worship Area will not be open from 9:00 AM—1:00 PM as there are children's activities taking place. Thank you for your understanding.

One of the administrative duties that needs to be addressed at this time is finalizing our budget. In our Diocese, the fiscal year follows the academic calendar. The old budget expires at the end of August, and September 1 begins a new fiscal year. We have been so blessed in the past few years in that we were able to create a balanced budget with minimal effort. This year is going to be a challenge. As everyone is experiencing, the cost of everything is climbing quickly, and unfortunately our collections have begun to decline. This year will take great effort to come up with a prudent and reasonable budget. We will keep sharpening the pencils and wearing out the erasers as we try to balance the numbers.

During the early evening, if I don't have appointments, I love to spend time outside doing yardwork. My favorite activity is pushing back overgrowth and trimming branches on trees and shrubs. My yard is an endless amusement park of activity. I respect Mother Nature and that she wants all living things to grow and flourish. I only take her on when the growth starts taking over walkways and starts pushing up against buildings. I think she understands.

This is the final week to sign up for the Freedom Tower and 9/11 museum trip on August 18. We need at least 10 more to sign up in order for the trip to run.





## **July Saints**

As we began the month of July, I noticed there are quite a few of the "popular" saints with feast days that take place this month. For the next few weeks, we shall review the lives of some of these heroes and heroines of the Church.


First, on July 14th we celebrate the feast of **St. Kateri Tekakwitha**. She was also known as the "Lily of the Mohawks." Kateri was the first native American to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church. She was born in 1656 in the village of Ossernenon. She contracted smallpox as a young child and because of the scars, often wore a blanket hiding her face. Her entire family died from this disease, so she was raised by her uncle who was the chief of the Mohawk clan. Kateri was known as a skilled worker and was diligent and patient. However, she refused to marry, and eventually the family accepted that she had no interest in marrying. At the age of 19, she converted to Catholicism, taking a vow of chastity. Again, this decision was unpopular with her adoptive parents and neighbors. They started rumors about her being a witch, so she moved to a Christian community south of Montreal. She often prayed for the conversion of her fellow Mohawks. The Jesuits that served in her community reported that she fasted and even tainted food to make it less desirable. She was sickly, and five years after becoming Catholic she passed away on April 17, 1680 at the age of 24. Her name Kateri, is the Mohawk form of Catherine, which she took from St. Catherine of Siena. She was canonized a saint by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, Native Americans, and people in exile.

Our second July saint is **St. Bonaventure** (original name – Giovanni Di Fidanza). Bonaventure means "O good fortune!" His feast is July 15<sup>th</sup>. He was from the Lazio region of central Italy, born in 1221. At the age of 22, he entered the Franciscan Order. He was sent to Paris to complete his studies and eventually became a close friend of St. Thomas Aquinas. He received the degree of Doctor along with his friend Thomas Aquinas. At the age of 35 he was chosen General of his Order. He did much for his Order and composed the Life of St. Francis. He was a very learned and respected man who Pope Clement IV nominated to be an Archbishop. Bonaventure begged not to be forced to accept that role. Instead, Gregory X forced a greater role upon him as a Cardinal and Bishop of Albano. He died on July 15, 1274 and was canonized a saint on April 14, 1482.


