A Ducks' game is a fun experience, but it does move along at a leisurely pace. We did our best to cheer on our home team, but unfortunately the Maryland Blue Crabs won the game 19-16. It was a great way to gather with parishioners and enjoy a beautiful summer day. I look forward to being able to offer this opportunity again next year.

Part of what we do as a parish community is deeply rooted in Catholic tradition, most specifically celebrating the Sacraments, liturgical life of the Church and passing along the faith in our Religious Education programs. 
Our Consolation Ministry Needs Your Help!



Summer Cash Sizzle

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing, and so, we present the “*Summer Cash Sizzle*.” This is a similar idea, however it is offered on a quarterly basis.

- \$10 per ticket
- Tickets are available for purchase through June, July and August.
- Drawing will be held August 31st.

Because we anticipate smaller participation, there is a different pay scale:

- * 10 Prizes @ \$50
