

STILL FRIENDLY AFTER ALL THESE YEARS

On two occasions in the past week, parishioners spoke to me about how they were drawn to this parish by a welcoming and friendly spirit. One woman came to find Holy Cross almost 25 years ago. Another family moved to the area just a few months ago. In both instances, these folks were "shopping around" for a parish. Not to say that other parishes are mean-spirited or rude, but many people report there is a consistent experience of a positive energy and sense of welcome when folks come here.

It is not as though we have a formal "Welcome Wagon." For some, the architecture and design of our Worship Area communicates that this church looks different than other churches which may contribute to their feeling that this is a special place. But somehow woven into the fabric of who we are and what we do is a sense of welcome. Be it an usher at the door or a friendly person they choose to sit next to, that message is communicated. This kind of widespread experience does not come about from one person; rather it is nurtured by many. It is something to be proud of. We strive to allow this to be a place where people can continue to grow in their relationship with the Lord in a joyful and life-giving environment.

We are undertaking a necessary project at the parish house. On the long driveway up to my house there is a retaining wall. It doesn't get taller than about 3 feet, but it is 200 feet long. I believe it is more than 30 years old. When I first arrived at the parish it was straight as an arrow. I do my best to keep the greenery and growth around it in check, but through the years it started to bow out in various places. At this point it looks like a string of Pringle potato chips lined up with lots of curves and waves. It needs to be replaced. It is a labor-intensive project as well as needing 14 pallets of retaining blocks. It is not cheap: about \$15,000. But this is one of those items, where preventive maintenance is cheaper than an unexpected and costly collapse. Happily our Renovations and Major Repairs account is in good shape, so we can easily absorb the cost. Thank you to all who continue to contribute to this account which keeps us from getting wet when a rainy day comes along.

Life in the parish slowly but steadily continues to return to full strength. We are mindful there are some corners of parish life where additional help is needed which we will need to address as we move forward. Ministers of Consolation, Fundraising Committee, help with wedding rehearsals, and Altar Servers are some of those areas. Look for additional information regarding these areas of life in the parish, and perhaps you may be able to lend a helping hand.

There are still a few weeks of summer to enjoy. Have fun.



BACKGROUND SCREENING UPDATE

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5-year intervals. volunteers/employees.

A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

- 1. Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org
- 2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct provided during the Virtus registration process.
- 3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application offered during the Virtus registration process.

Active Volunteers:

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened, you may be at—or beyond—the *5yr. rescreening requirement*. If this is the case, you will receive an email from *Sterling Volunteers* asking you to complete the background screening application online. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. *Please be aware—this is not a scam nor has your email been hacked.* The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically re-sign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

Edit Your Virtus Account:

To access your Virtus account www.Virtus.org you will need your Username and Password. If you need assistance, please contact Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 or helpdesk@virtus.org. Once in your account, review your account information—particularly your email address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen, in the green column, click "Update My Account." You will be able to make the necessary changes. Please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.

Summer Cash Sizzle

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "Summer Cash Sizzle." This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.

- This formula was based upon selling 250 tickets @ \$10 each. If more than 250 tickets are sold, the number of prizes will be increased. (In the event the response is strong, we will resume a monthly drawing as soon as possible.)
- Tickets will not be sold after Mass. Please use the tear-off tickets below. You may return your entries by placing them in an envelope and depositing it in the basket on weekends, or returning them to the Parish Office.
