

VACATION ADVENTURES

Sometimes on a vacation you plan an activity that includes a certain level of excitement or adventure. Other times adventure seeks you out. Last week I traveled with a few former colleagues who I used to work with when I was chaplain at the high school. Our travels included Las Vegas. No, no one in the group hit the jackpot.

I booked a morning excursion with a company called Rail Explorers. It is based about 40 minutes outside the city. We were on a specially built pedal railcar that holds four passengers. In addition to our pedal power, there is also an electric motor that does the lion's share of the work. The trip includes traversing a stretch of about five miles of rail, turning around and then returning to the station. It was a hoot. The car travels only about 20mph, but being that close to rails feels like you are flying along. The wind trying to blow our hats off and the clickity-clack of the rails truly made for a fun outing. Just about the time it was starting to get a little boring, the trip came to an end. It was a great way to begin our day.

Another day, our plans included doing some hiking on Mount Charleston. Mount Charleston is located northwest of the city. One advantage of including it in a summer itinerary is that it is often 20-30 degrees cooler than Vegas. We began our way up the mountain and stopped at the Visitor Center to learn more about the area and the hiking options that were available. While we were there, we heard a few rumbles of thunder but didn't think too much about it.

We began our ascent in our rented mini-van across the highest pass on the mountain to get to our destination. No sooner were we on the road when a light rain began. Before long that became a steady downpour, then a deluge, and before we knew it, we were facing blinding rain and hail. This was progressing from a pleasant drive, to an adventure, to downright dangerous. On two occasions we had to pull off the road as it did not feel safe to continue. Rivers of mud began crisscrossing the road. We could see bright sky in the direction we were heading and trusted that moving forward was the safest option. A few other cars passed us while we were stopped, so we knew we were not alone. The most dangerous stretch of road was about a hundred yards long, it was covered in a couple inches of muddy water, and there was an obstacle course of rocks that had rolled down from the hills. As soon as we had gotten out of this narrow notch, the rain stopped and the skies cleared. I have a deeper appreciation for how people suddenly find themselves in trouble in a flash flood. While I don't think we were ever in imminent danger, it was far more than we bargained for. In spite of it all, I can say it was a grand adventure.

I hope your summer is holding a few safe but exciting adventures for you. Enjoy.



LITURGY BYTES

More Saints



At the end of July, the Church celebrated the feast day of Sts. Joachim and Anne. Saints Joachim and Anne are the parents of the Blessed Mother Mary and the grandparents of Jesus.

As we read in the Scriptures, particularly the Gospels of Mathew and Luke, a family history of Jesus is furnished tracing His ancestry. However, it is interesting to note that Jesus' mother's family is neglected. We know they existed, but we know very little factually about them. The heroism and holiness of these people is inferred from the whole family atmosphere around Mary in the Bible. We do see in her a fulfillment of many generations of prayerful persons, especially herself steeped in the religious traditions of her people. The strong character of Mary in making decisions, her continuous practice of prayer, her devotion to the laws of her faith, her steadiness at moments of crisis, and her devotion to her relatives—all indicate a very close-knit, loving family.

Joachim and Anne represent a quiet series of generations of people who performed their duties, practiced their faith, and established an atmosphere for the coming of the Messiah, even though they remain a bit obscure. Joachim and Anne are the patron saints of grandparents, and their feast day should remind grandparents today of their responsibility to establish for future generations the traditions of both their faith and their family.

The feast also has a message for the younger generations to be aware of older people's perspective, experience, and wisdom. Their feast is celebrated on July 26th. Sts. Joachim and Anne are perfect examples for us and powerful intercessors. Below is the prayer for the feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, asking their intercession, that we may be drawn closer to God.

O Lord, God of our Fathers, who bestowed on Saints Joachim and Anne this grace, that of them should be born the Mother of your incarnate Son, grant, through the prayers of both, that we may attain the salvation you have promised to your people. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

COOKING OUT OF THE PANTRY

TUNA TACOS WITH LIME CREMA

(Makes 4 Servings)

INGREDIENTS

Lime Crema:

- 2 Tbsp mayonnaise
- 2 Tbsp sour cream
- 1 lime, zested
- 2 tsp lime juice
- 1/8 tsp kosher salt

Tuna Tacos:

- 2-5oz cans of tuna, drained*
- 2 tsp taco seasoning
- 1-2 Tbsp vegetable oil
- 4 soft taco shells



DIRECTIONS

Lime Crema:

- 1. In a small bowl, whisk together mayonnaise, sour cream, lime zest, lime juice, and salt.
- 2. Refrigerate for ~15 minutes.

Tuna Tacos:

- 1. Combine drained tuna and taco seasoning in medium bowl. Mix well. *If using tuna in water, add 1-2 tsp of vegetable oil to moisten tuna and help seasoning adhere*.
- 2. Heat 1 Tbsp of vegetable oil in medium pan.
- 3. Add tuna to hot oil and warm tuna through (~1-2 minutes).
- 4. Warm soft shells in a separate dry pan.
- 5. Add ¼ of tuna mixture to each taco shell.
- 6. Top with crema.

CILANTRO AND LIME SLAW

(Makes ~4 Servings)

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups cabbage, shredded
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup red onion, thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup cilantro, finely chopped
- 1 lime, juiced
- 1 Tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- ½ Tbsp honey
- 1/4 tsp kosher salt

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Combine cabbage, onion and cilantro in medium bowl.
- 2. In a separate bowl, combine lime juice, olive oil, honey, and salt. Whisk together well.
- 3. Pour dressing over slaw mixture, and mix well.
- 4. Cover bowl and refrigerate slaw for at least 30 minutes.



COOKING OUT OF THE PANTRY

PINEAPPLE SALSA

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup canned pineapple, finely chopped
- ½ red bell pepper, finely chopped
- 1 Tbsp red onion, finely chopped
- 1 Tbsp cilantro, finely chopped
- ½ lime, juiced
- ½ tsp kosher salt

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Combine pineapple, pepper, onion, and cilantro in bowl.
- 2. Add lime juice and salt.
- 3. Mix well.
- 4. Refrigerate for ~15 minutes.



PEACHES 'N CREAM CUPCAKES

(Makes ~18 cupcakes)

*Ingredients may vary depending on cake mix used

INGREDIENTS

- 1 box of yellow cake mix
- 1 cup water*
- ½ cup vegetable oil*
- 3 eggs*
- Cupcake baking cups
- 1-15oz can sliced peaches
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1 Tbsp confectioners sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Cook cupcakes according to directions on box. Let cool.
- 2. Drain peaches and reserve two peach slices to top cupcakes.
- 3. Finely chop remaining peaches.
- 4. In a large bowl, whip heavy cream until soft peaks are formed. Add vanilla and sugar, and continue whipping until stiff peaks form.
- 5. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of whipped cream to chopped peaches. Mix until uniform.
- 6. Using a small sharp knife, core the cupcakes \sim 3/4 way through, without puncturing the bottom.
- 7. Spoon peach mixture into the center of each cupcake.
- 8. Cover tops of cupcakes with remaining whipped cream.
- 9. Slice reserved peaches into enough slices so there's one to garnish each cupcake.
- 10. Top each cupcake with a peach slice, and serve.
