SHORT CIRCUITED

In the past week and a half, many of the electronic devices in my life went haywire. It started with the router in my house failing, which meant I lost Wi-Fi. A trip down to the Optimum office to get a new router corrected that issue. Next, the picture on my flat-screen TV at the house disappeared. The sound still worked fine, but my imagination is not that good to provide images for everything I was missing. A visit to Costco and ringing up one hefty purchase addressed that crisis. Finally, on the weekend, my phone lost the ability to receive or make calls. It would ring and I could dial out, but I could not hear anyone nor could they hear me. I was in the midst of trying to make an appointment at the help desk in the Apple store, when several of the ladies in the office determined I somehow did something with my settings to create the problem. Happily, they got me back on the air. We don't realize how much we depend upon these things until they stop working. Hopefully, I will not be drifting around in cyberspace any time soon.

At the Masses last weekend, we failed to pray for the thirteen U.S. military soldiers who died in Afghanistan. It was an unfortunate oversight. I regret that tragic loss was not included in our prayer.

It is Labor Day weekend. We pray that the workforce and employment crisis that surround us settles down. I think all of us have experienced the result of businesses with too few employees: large purchases are back ordered, wait times for customer service can be excessive, and help-wanted signs are posted everywhere. This holiday was created to affirm the hard work and dignity of all workers by providing a well-deserved day off. We pray that value of a deeply rooted work ethic may not be lost. We also pray that all workers are provided a safe and just work environment.

Next Saturday our nation remembers a painful moment in our history. It is hard to believe that 20 years have passed since those fateful events of September 11. We all have deeply etched memories of how that day unfolded in each of our lives. The physical and emotional scars of those events are still carried by many. The politics that surround the threats of war and terrorism remain tumultuous. We pray for wise and prudent leaders who will work to build a better world. We pray for all those who place their lives in harms way for our safety and protection.

For those involved in the world of education, enjoy your final days before your routine (or some variation of it) returns. Farewell summer!



Children's Liturgy of the Word


Children's Liturgy of the Word allows children in grades K-4 to hear God's Word in language they can understand and gives them the opportunity to ask and answer questions.

LITURGY BYTES

Elevating Your Experience of the Liturgy



After more than a year of dispensations from attending Mass, Catholics around the world are taking a look at the liturgy with fresh eyes. As the saying goes, “**Absence makes the heart grow fonder.**” This weekend’s Liturgy Bytes reflection centers on some of the prayers of the Mass that never change.

In recent months, many of us experienced the Mass on TV, or via a computer or tablet because of the pandemic. Most parishes are continuing to offer Mass via YouTube or live streaming because there are parishioners who are still not able to come to Church for Mass. Many offered comments of gratitude, and still do, to be able to “attend” Mass at their local parish using the technology available to us today.

No matter where technology takes us, and no matter how we use it, the most **basic principle about liturgy never changes.** Liturgy is a celebration of the Paschal Mystery. Over the years, we have been instructed to pray it well with reverence and dignity. In recent years (2011), we saw a few changes in the prayers of the Mass said by the Presider as well as a few changes in the people’s responses, too. Thus, we experienced the birth of the third edition of the Roman Missal. This edition reminds us that it closely adheres to the Latin official edition and includes more of the rich images and phrases not translated in previous English U.S. editions. In other words, now the prayers of the Mass are the same in all languages.

To return to the topic, and to also “whet your appetite” for our ***VIEW FROM THE PEW*** series beginning in September (see flyer on page 9), here are a few pointers about those Mass prayers that are said at each Mass.

Perhaps you too, like me, wash over them without paying much attention

to what is being said. Take the COLLECT for example—the collect forms the final part of the Introductory Rites of the Mass which includes the Penitential Act, the Kyrie and the Gloria. The US Conference of Catholic Bishops describes the collect as follows: The priest calls upon the people to pray and everybody, together with the priest, observes a brief silence so that they may become aware of God’s presence and may call to mind their intentions. It is addressed to God the Father, through Christ, in the Holy Spirit.

So, when you attend Mass the next time, be sure to listen for this prayer (at the beginning of Mass) and realize we are joining with the Presider in this prayer. Take a second or two to gather your thoughts and what you wish to pray for at this Mass. Give it a try, and you will be hooked and ready for it each time you attend Mass!

Here is an example of a Collect Prayer:

“O God, who causes the minds of the faithful to unite in a single purpose, grant your people to love what you command and to desire what you promise, that, amid the uncertainties of this world, our hearts may be fixed on that place where true gladness is found. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.”

Notice how the language is very tender and warm as we prepare ourselves at the beginning of Mass. The wording reminds us of God’s fatherly care, while also encouraging us towards dignity and reverence as we start the Mass.


