In case you think our music ministers have made a mistake in playing Christmas music this weekend, they have not. While for most folks, Christmas seems long ago and far away, for the Church the celebration continues through this weekend, the Baptism of the Lord. I'm sure they are already putting out Easter decorations in the stores.

At the 11:30 Mass we welcome back many of our families who celebrated a baptism in the past year. This is an appropriate day to continue to celebrate the gift of life and how their parents have chosen to pass along the gift of faith to their children. It is always a busy (and sometimes noisy) Mass, but one which abounds in life and energy.

We are happy to give away our poinsettias this weekend to those of you who have enough of a green thumb to keep them going well beyond Christmas. I know there is a complicated formula for keeping them in darkness if you want them to bloom for next Christmas, and some folks are good at making this happen.

As I have shared with you in the past, I enjoy the many forms of wildlife that surround my house. It seems the wildlife activity comes in waves, and right now is an active time.
