



RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

National Religious Freedom Day is observed on Jan. 16th every year since 1993 to commemorate the Virginia General Assembly's adoption of Thomas Jefferson's landmark Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom on Jan. 16, 1786. This vital document became the basis for the Constitution's First Amendment establishment clause and led to the protection of freedom of religion for all Americans.

An academic report from Princeton University argues that vigorously advancing religious freedom is in America's national interests:

- * The basis for religious freedom is awareness of the reality and dignity of the human person. Since religion is a human impulse to know and relate to something bigger than one's self and is a phenomenon found in all times and cultures, to interfere with living our religious experience, is to interfere with human fulfillment.
- *When citizens are free to have an ultimate commitment to something more than human, something beyond the authorities of state and society, the power of the State is thereby limited.
- *Morally, religion is just not religion unless it is done freely.
- *Legally, democracies have recognized that far from being a marginal special interest – religious freedom is a central human right.
