Gray Days, or... Maybe Not

The days of winter can be described as gray because of shorter hours of daylight and winter storms that bring in an abundance of dreary clouds. But, my title has nothing to do with the weather. This week was the second anniversary of my mom's death. The days leading up to that date were a whirlwind of pastoral calls dealing with circumstances of death and dying. As I write this column, we have three funerals scheduled for this week. We average about 40-45 funerals a year, so having three in one week is unusual. I think I celebrated the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick six times recently. On average, I am asked once or twice a month to celebrate the sacrament, in addition to the regular monthly celebration. Six times in a week is more than the norm. I was even called to Good Shepherd Hospice in Port Jefferson, which is where my mother died.

I'm not complaining. All of these occasions were truly moments of grace. It reminds me how privileged I am to have the gift of priesthood and to share in important moments of life with so many families. I would not describe these days as being particularly sad or upsetting. But, I found myself scratching my head and asking what is happening here. Why are there so many of these events happening at this moment? What are you teaching me, Lord?

Two things happened to balance this out. First, last Sunday at the 11:30 Mass we had at least a dozen families come to our Baptism Anniversary Mass to receive a blessing. It was an uplifting celebration. At one point, the chorus of toddler noise was so pronounced that it rattled the rafters. We were all immersed in the sounds of new life, that I couldn't help but smile. Secondly, I simply came to an awareness that in many ways God has healed my heart. Time and time again this week, he brought me into situations that reminded me of painful days, but they did not overwhelm me. I had the strength and focus to minister as I needed to. There was an intensity to these days but also a sense of peace. I had an unexpected sense of balance. As St. Paul says, "*Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?*" (1 Cor. 15:55) I felt grounded in the Lord, and that was all I needed.

The cross of Jesus is the predominant symbol we see as we enter our Worship Area. It is an ever-present reminder of the Paschal Mystery, the dying and rising of our Lord. That mystery is mirrored in our lives. It is not a single occasion reserved for the moment of death, but rather it is repeated time and time again as life unfolds. In order to know the gift of new life, we have to work our way through moments of being immersed in pain, surrender, and death. We all have these days, but we are a people renewed in the life of our Lord. Allow that gift to touch your heart. Happy Days! ☺

A Very Short Survey

. . . . with a Very Long Introduction

One of the realities of Church life is that the number of priests in active ministry continues to decline. Our neighboring parish, St. Joseph's in Ronkonkoma, will be losing a priest this June. They will be going from three resident priests to two. (At one point in time, that parish probably had six priests assigned there.) International priests coming to our Diocese are reducing some of the impact of these declining numbers, but the downward trend continues.

In some extreme circumstances, parishes may need to merge or be combined. For example, in the Five Towns area of Nassau the demographics of that area have changed so significantly that the Catholic representation is only a small fraction of the overall population. In that instance, three parishes may be combined into one. In other areas it may be necessary for neighboring parishes to work closely together in a spirit of cooperation. The two parishes would continue to remain independent parishes, but there may only be one priest to serve two communities.

Don't panic, there are no imminent or drastic changes that are quickly coming to Holy Cross. But, it could very well be that somewhere down the road Holy Cross may not have a resident pastor. Or, if Holy Cross has a resident pastor, he may also be responsible for the sacramental needs of another parish. There are no specific or immediate plans for our parish, but something like this may happen in the future.

Pastors have been asked to begin to raise this vital issue within our parishes so people can begin to think about the possibilities. Additionally, pastors have been asked to begin conversations within Deaneries (small geographic groupings of 8 or 9 parishes) to look at scheduling of Masses and other sacraments. Are we currently using the priest personnel we have in the best way possible to serve the most number of people? For example, does it make sense for every parish to have a 9:00AM daily Mass? Might it be more beneficial for one parish to have an early morning Mass and another have one at noon? Again, there are no specific plans to uproot and change life here at Holy Cross. But, we want to begin to look if there are possibilities to consider if circumstances were to change. To that end, I ask for your input regarding the following two questions:

- ◆ Is there a time during the week that you would prefer daily Mass to be celebrated and that you would likely attend?

 - ◆ Is there a different/additional day and time that you would like to see the Sacrament of Reconciliation offered?

 - ◆ Please list any other suggestions/comments related to this matter:

Winter Ordinary Time



Now that the last of the wreaths and flowers of Christmas leave our worship space, the Church moves into the all too familiar season of Ordinary Time or as I prefer to call this brief interlude – WINTER ORDINARY TIME (6 weeks long). # YOUTH MINISTRY


