

The Jingle Bells are Fading

I still have my (real) tree up, and it is certainly time for it to be retired. The branches are drooping and ornaments are dropping. Time to break out the boxes and start packing up.

This year the Christmas schedule was particularly busy as Christmas fell on a Monday. That meant Christmas Eve was on Sunday with the regular Sunday morning Masses followed by the Christmas Eve Masses later in the afternoon and night. The Baptism of the Lord is usually the final Sunday celebration in the Christmas season. However, this year it gets bumped to Monday (tomorrow). This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany.

As busy as it was, it got a bit more complicated for me. As many of you heard, I awoke early on Christmas Eve morning with a terrible bout of vertigo. I ended up in the emergency room at St. Catherine's for about 6 hours. Happily it passed quickly enough, and I have not had a reoccurrence. I understand that for some people it is a persistent or reoccurring problem. I can't imagine dealing with that level of dizziness on a regular basis. I am most grateful to Fr. Frank who jumped in to cover my absence. He ended up saying five of the six Masses on December 24th. His feet were smoking by the end of the day. I am also grateful to my priest friends who were arranging Mass coverage if I was not well for Christmas day. I feel blessed it was a minor crisis that resolved itself quickly.

Thank you for an extremely abundant Christmas collection. We received one very large gift which boosted our overall total. But even if we put that aside, we were up about 15% from last year's totals. As I write this column we have not yet hit the grand total button for the final time, but it looks like it will be near \$43,000, which is almost \$10,000 more than last year! I am most grateful for all who have responded so generously, both for the parking lot as well as the Christmas collection. It is only with the support of so many that we are able to continue our work and ministry. Many thanks.

Holy Cross is pleased that we will be offering a spirituality program called Alpha. The weekly meeting begins with a shared meal. The evening continues with reflections on how each of us can deepen our relationship with the Lord Jesus. It was our hope to begin the program in January. But, it is now going to work better for this opportunity to be offered in the spring. Watch for details.

Please keep my Mom, Catherine, in your prayers. It was a tough December for her. She fell at home at the beginning of the month which led to a nine-day hospital stay followed by three weeks of rehab. On January 2nd we were able to get her home under Hospice care. It will take some time to get her into a new routine with an aide, but it is important for her to be at home.




