Preparing for Thanksgiving

The gospel reading for this weekend is the story of the healing of the lepers. Ten men who were afflicted seek to find Jesus, and when they do so, they ask for healing. Jesus heals all ten. But, only one of them returns to Jesus to thank him for the gift of new life that he received. Traditionally, this is the gospel reading that is used on Thanksgiving Day. Hearing it this weekend helps to create a theme of gratitude weeks before we come to the holiday.

This weekend, we are reminded to look at our lives and to embrace the blessings we have been given. In what ways have we encountered Jesus and recognized the ways in which he has blessed us with friendship, healing, forgiveness, a call to discipleship, etc.? Sometimes we can readily identify how God has touched our lives. Other times, it requires some reflection for us to appreciate the more subtle ways in which God has graced us with His gifts. When I was on retreat last week, I was overcome in gratitude in remembering the wondrous ways that God has spoken to me throughout my life.

Unfortunately, sometimes it takes losing something or even the threat of losing it to make us realize how blessed we are. One of the great blessings of my life is this parish community of Holy Cross. Last June, I was completing my first term of six years as Pastor and was looking forward to being renewed for a second term. It is common practice within our diocese for a pastor to serve two terms in the same parish. Everything seemed to be unfolding on pace for me to receive my second six-year term here. Then, one day in May I got a somewhat ambiguous/ominous e-mail from the Bishop's Office. The way in which the message was written led me to believe I was being transferred. It took about 6 hours to clarify what was happening. In fact, there were no problems. But, fear took hold, and I thought I might be losing something precious in my life. That afternoon was not very pleasant, but having gone through it makes me appreciate all the more what I have.

When someone celebrates Reconciliation with me, 95% of the time I offer them the same penance; say three Our Fathers. For many years, I gave the instruction to offer those prayers in thanksgiving for the blessings of their life. More recently, I have changed it to offering the prayers for peace in the world. Maybe, is there wisdom in switching back? A true spirit of gratitude becomes an umbrella that embraces all things.

Prepare for Thanksgiving now. That does not mean you have to start mashing the potatoes, but rather be mindful of the blessings of your life. I suppose one day of gratitude is not a bad thing. But, living our lives in an on-going way with the realization that we have been richly blessed allows us to continually acknowledge God's presence.

LITURGY BYTES

Thought for the week: “The Mass is ended...” – Mission Impossible?



Concluding this week with our series about the Mass, we come upon the dismissal rite. You may be asking, what does this dismissal mean for us? Let's see what the Catechism of the Catholic Church has to say. The CCC explains that “the liturgy in which the mystery of salvation is accomplished concludes with the sending forth (mission) of the faithful, so that they may fulfill God's will in their daily lives” (#1332).

I can recall when my children were young, and I breathed a sigh of relief when the dismissal words were proclaimed by either the Priest or Deacon! We made it through without too many interruptions, and now we could go home and the children could play and be noisy! However, as years passed on, I started to begin to understand what those words really meant and focused on one word in particular “go!”

I began to understand that we are being dismissed to carry on our mission – to be missionaries – to take the Christ we have received in Word and in Communion out with us into the world. This mission is concerned with an authentic life lived in accord with the Gospel, striving for holiness and spiritual growth in prayer. In other words, we are called to bring the Gospel message to our families, neighbors and world so that we, too, have an important role in being missionary disciples by the faithful witness of our lives.

So, the next time you hear “Go in peace to love and serve the Lord,” remember the emphasis is on the word GO! The Church is reminding us that we are not called to remain huddled together in the Church, but to go out and carry out the mission of the Church in our everyday lives. Is it “Mission Impossible”? Not really. You just need to be willing and trust in what was started at your Baptism.

As I have seen in my short time here at the Parish of the Holy Cross, this mission to “go forth” is embraced by so many wonderful people who truly take this mission seriously. Many of these “missionaries” have developed the life of this worshipping community. However, there is always room for more!



RELIGIOUS FREEDOM



Worldwide Religious Freedom Abuses

Christians continue to be the most persecuted religious group in the world with significant increases in 2019. Watchdog groups, Release International and Open Doors, have particular concern for believers in China, India, & Nigeria.

China: In 2018, China was on track to contain the world's largest Christian population by 2030, thanks to a surge in underground house churches. The Council on Foreign Relations (CFR) estimated the number of Protestants at anywhere from 58-115 million, and Catholics range from 10-12 million. About 1/3 of Christians attend the government sanctioned church groups: The Protestant Three-Self Church and the Chinese Patriotic Catholic Church. Still, Christians face growing repression and China is ranked as a country where it's most difficult and dangerous to practice Christianity.

- Over 2,000 crosses have been burned & ripped down and many churches demolished.
- The Communist regime is now demanding churches replace postings of the Ten Commandments with sayings of Chinese President Xi Jinping.
- Some sanctioned churches require pastors to incorporate communist ideology in their sermons.
- Some congregations are threatened to be blacklisted, meaning travel restrictions, schooling and future employment of their children will be impeded.
- By 2020, 600 million surveillance cameras will monitor all citizens, believers, and religious activities such as who buys Bibles, etc.
- Chinese Christians will only be able to purchase the Communism-friendly version of the Bible.
- There is a nationwide effort to exalt President Xi who says that religion must be guided by the party to adapt to socialist society.

In light of this ongoing crackdown on religious freedom, house church leaders are going back to underground practices.

Today, Christianity is being labeled as a "Western Ideology" that must be resisted at all costs by the Chinese people.
