

# **Autumn Unfolds**

The temperature is dropping, days of sunlight are growing shorter, and trees are becoming vibrant with autumn colors. All these workings of Mother Nature remind us that we are in a transitional season heading towards the days of winter. I enjoy all the experiences that are part of living in a region that includes four distinct seasons. I hope you, too, find joy in all that the season offers.

One of my favorite autumn tasks is to make sure I am well stocked in firewood at the house. I finished splitting the last of the logs about a month ago. Now, it is neatly stacked and ready to go. Honestly, I probably have about three seasons worth of wood available. I don't use much at all during the course of the winter, but I am stocked up, just in case. Maybe, could this become a fundraiser for the parish? Some monks and religious communities make jelly, others print up greeting cards, still others bake bread. Maybe we could bundle and sell Holy Cross kindling and yule logs!

Training for new altar servers is well underway. Within the next few weeks you should see seven of our young parishioners begin to serve in this ministry. I am truly grateful for the help they offer in celebrating the Eucharist. And, I think for all of us, it is a blessing to see their enthusiasm and willingness to serve the Church at such a young age. My Church career began in the same way. I was a faithful altar server for many years. Although, there was a perk in altar serving when you attended a Catholic school. Sometimes you were pulled out of class to serve at a funeral Mass. I did not object to missing math for the sake of this holy ministry.

Over the last few weeks there has been extensive work going on in our bell tower and in the service "shed" in back of the Parish Office. Verizon is updating and switching out much of the equipment. I suppose this needs to be done on a fairly frequent basis to keep up with the technology. It is remarkable to see the complexity of all that is involved. If you recall, several years ago we entered into a lease with Verizon to rent our bell tower and turn it into a cell tower. This agreement has worked well so far. There is no negative impact to life in the parish, and we benefit by receiving over \$2,600 a month in rent. They just need to patch up the torn screens at the top of the tower to keep our friendly pigeons out.

This Friday we look forward to another fun/social event here at Holy Cross. There is a Halloween Party being offered to our young people in grades 5–8 in our Religious Education program. This is a new offering (as was our Fall Festival) for the parish. I am most grateful to our Coordinator of Religious Education, Tricia Clarke, for her creativity and imagination in offering these opportunities. We are also appreciative to the many helping hands that bring an event like this to fruition.

As we draw near to the holiday season (the busiest time for Parish Outreach), we invite you to consider these suggestions on ways to join us in "Being Christ" for our neighbors who continue to struggle in their life journey.



1. Monetary "basket" donations (cash, check or supermarket gift cards) will be appreciated to help defray the expenses of our **Thanksgiving Basket Program**. You can mark your envelope "Thanksgiving" and drop it in the collection basket.



2. Volunteer shoppers are needed to purchase and package a Thanksgiving basket for a needy family. You will be given a menu/shopping list and gift cards to cover the cost. We anticipate about 60 baskets will be provided to families in our community this year. 4. Participate in our **Christmas "Be An Angel" program**. Again this year, we will provide gift cards to the families Outreach assists throughout the year and gifts for several other agencies. This program will run from November 16<sup>th</sup> through December 8th. Future bulletins will contain important information on this year's Christmas Angel program.


