Needless to say, this Thursday is Thanksgiving. For the first time since I have been ordained, I will not be home to celebrate Thanksgiving Mass. This past summer, my sister moved from New Jersey to Tampa, Florida. I will be flying out on Thursday morning so that I can be with her family for their first Thanksgiving in their new home. I don't plan on doing this every year, but it worked out that I could make it this time, so I am taking advantage of the opportunity. I am leaving you in good hands; Father Frank will be here to celebrate our traditional Thanksgiving Mass at 9:00 AM. I will be flying back on Saturday. (By the way, all Parish Offices are closed on both Thursday and Friday).

Since my Mom died, my siblings have found we need to make an effort to stay in touch with each other. My Mom was always the "common denominator" in terms of where we would gather. In the later years of her life we often needed to speak on the phone to keep each other updated if there were any medical issues or things going on in her life. And, now since my sister moved, we have even more miles between us. We need to make conscious efforts to reach out to one another to maintain those important family ties. I did not want to pass on this opportunity for me to be with my sister for the holiday.

For many, Thanksgiving is a great day for family fun and unity. If that is your experience on this happy day, count it as a blessing. For some, Thanksgiving can be a difficult day because of tension or discord within the family. If you are in that situation, pray for the wisdom of the Spirit to do what needs to be done or not done. Seeking true peace and harmony requires a discerning heart. Any need to be the one who is right, or in control, or to say "I told you so," will probably not lead you to experience much healing or new life. Offer to the Lord those parts of your family that need healing, and trust He will lead you where you need to go.

Don't get me started on one of my pet peeves of Thanksgiving Day. I find it troublesome when Thanksgiving is seen as the opening ceremony to a bonanza of retail shopping. Yes, it is nice to give well chosen gifts to loved ones. Yes, seeking good value in what we spend is a virtue. Yes, there are people whose livelihood is rooted in retail sales. Yes, I suppose in the right context shopping might even be a fun, family activity. But, something seems to go a little haywire and shopping takes on more of a life than is necessary. Imagine if everyone embraced a wave of praying, or acts of charity, or spending time with family in the same way. May Thanksgiving and those who are dear to you be a great blessing and source of joy.

LITURGY BYTES - *Christ the King*

On the Church's calendar, this weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, more commonly known as the feast of Christ the King. For all you "liturgical nerds" LIKE ME, here are some facts about this special feast:

1. It is the final Sunday in the liturgical year, as next weekend we begin the season of Advent – a new year in the Church's calendar.
2. The feast of Christ the King began in 1925.
3. It was celebrated on the last Sunday in October, just before the feast of All Saints.
4. In 1969, Pope Paul VI revised the feast giving its current name and moving it to the last Sunday of the liturgical year.
5. Why this feast? The feast was a response to secularization, atheism and communism rising after the First World War. At that time, the world was telling Christians to compartmentalize their religion and give their allegiance to the government, so Pope Pius XI wrote an encyclical entitled: *Quas Primas* ("in the first"). Pius XI suggests that the kingdom of Christ embraces all mankind. Pius explained that by virtue of Christ's claim to kingship as creator and redeemer, societies as well as individuals owe him obligations as king. (paraphrased)
6. Despite its Catholic origins, this feast is celebrated by many Protestant denominations such as the: Lutherans, Anglicans, Methodists and Presbyterians.
7. There are two exceedingly tall images of Christ the King in our world. One in Poland and one in Rio de Janeiro in Brazil.



So, let us give praise to Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of endless glory. Have a blessed week.

STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE

Automated Giving through Automated Clearing House (ACH) Transactions

An ACH transaction is a paperless, electronic transfer from one bank to another.



If you have your paycheck automatically deposited to your savings or checking account directly from your employer's account, you are participating in an ACH transaction. If you are collecting a pension from a former employer, or are collecting Social Security benefits, your check is being directly deposited into your savings or checking account, and you, too, are participating in an ACH transaction. If you pay your mortgage, your LIPA, your telephone bill or any other bill by going on-line to your own bank account and instructing your bank to pay these bills out of your account, you are participating in an ACH transaction.

In all these examples, you have complete control of the amount that is withdrawn or deposited through the safeguards put in place by the banking industry and the Federal Government laws that govern that industry. You can instantaneously check your account summary on-line which is secure and private because of the use of passwords and security measures. No one has access to your account that you do not designate. At the end of the month you receive your bank statement in the mail for your review, or you can check on-line.

Automated Giving at Holy Cross came about in the following way. Our Pastoral Council, Finance Committee and Stewardship Committee studied **Automated Giving** as it related to parishioner contributions. We listened to presentations at the parish from companies that handled this entirely for the parish, and from our own local bank that would set it up for us to handle ourselves. After thorough research and debate in all the committees, a unanimous decision to proceed with Automated Giving with the Bank of Smithtown (now People's United Bank) was presented to the Pastoral Team.

The set-up process is through our Business Manager, who has the **sole responsibility** for the initial set up and ongoing transactions of automated giving in which parishioners may elect to participate. Total confidentiality is observed at each step. So, at this time, the Parish of the Holy Cross is offering this **option** to you. Please know you do not have to change your manner of giving. But if you choose:

This means you have the option of giving your weekly contribution to the parish by filling out the Automated Giving form on the next page, which designates your bank routing number and account number (found on the bottom of your check) and the amount you elect to give to Holy Cross on a bi-weekly or monthly basis.

Are there benefits to you?

- Reflecting on our personal Stewardship, we have the opportunity to give thought to the daily blessings we have received.
- You will never arrive at Church to discover you don't have your envelope.
- If you are unable to be present at Holy Cross because of inclement weather, a planned vacation or sickness, your contribution will still be offered as you had decided.

Are there benefits for the parish?

- The parish will be able to budget knowing what your annual gift of treasure will be.
