Holy Days for Holy People

This week the Church celebrated two distinct but important feast days. The first was on Thursday, All Saints' Day. On this day, the Church collectively remembers all the holy men and women who have lived their lives in heroic ways that give witness to God's love. Most Catholics have a saint with whom they have a connection. The Irish love St. Patrick. The Italians love St. Anthony (as do I; he helps me find my wallet that I misplace about five times a week). Actually, I do have an affection for St. John Chrysostom. He lived in the fourth century. There are parts of his life that connect to my life. His father died when he was young. He knew at an early age he wanted to be a priest. He had a love for preaching. Understanding the life of some of our saints connects us to part of the greater story of salvation. We follow in the footsteps of holy people who have walked before us.

On Friday we celebrated the feast of All Souls. There are certain celebrations in the Church that work very naturally. For example, on Ash Wednesday we don't need to convince people to come to Church. Great numbers of people automatically come because there is something about that day that "works." All Souls' Day is another one of those days. We don't need to convince ourselves to remember and pray for our loved ones who have gone before us; it happens naturally.

There is something beautiful and life-giving when we realize we do not share in the experience of death alone. But, in different ways we have all faced that cross and know the pain of loss. This All Souls' Day was a bit more poignant for me. This was my first All Souls' Day when I prayed for my Mom. Her funeral was here at Holy Cross, so her name was mentioned in the litany of those who were buried from our parish. We really do share in the Paschal Mystery together, and there is great life that comes from that. These are days when God feels particularly close to His people.

This past Wednesday I attended the annual Town of Smithtown Prayer Breakfast. This gathering started decades ago by former Supervisor, Patrick Vecchio. The tradition is being continued by the current Supervisor, Edward Wehrheim. Local business leaders, politicians and clergy gather for a meal and spend a bit of time sharing in an ecumenical prayer service. It is a simple gathering, but I am happy to be part of it.

PARISH OUTREACH



Next weekend, November 10th and 11th, will be the first weekend of our Outreach Parish Christmas Project. We are once again requesting **gift cards** to local stores (i.e., Kohls, Target, Wal-Mart) to enable our families to purchase for themselves and their children the items they need.

As you may know we have also helped the following agencies for the last several years and will continue to do so this Christmas:

Olsen's Rest Home is a neighborhood facility for frail elderly on Gibbs Pond Road. Residents of the home have always been considered members of our parish community. Holy Cross ministers to our friends at Olsen's in a variety of ways during the year.

Mercy Haven is a provider of housing and other services for persons who are elderly, those living with mental illness, those families who are on limited income and those with special needs.

Pronto is a human service agency located in Brentwood helping people in need with food, clothing and other basic necessities. They assist approximately 500 families for the holidays each year.

Talbot House Chemical Dependency Crisis Center is a 24-hour voluntary chemical dependence crisis center licensed by the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services to provide short-term medically monitored inpatient withdrawal services to adult men and women who are in crisis. This facility provides nourishing meals, counseling, limited transportation, support groups, and referrals.
