

Does My Car Really Need Premium Unleaded?

Due to early deadlines, this article was written before Christmas. It may help inspire your New Year's resolutions.

You may recall, early in the summer I needed to get a new car. I narrowed my options down and happily chose my little Honda. After about 2 weeks I needed to get my first tank of gas. Much to my dismay I read the instruction, "Premium Fuel Recommended." My objection, of course, is to the additional cost for this gas. I was annoyed with myself because that was one of the items on my checklist to look for in the cars I was considering. Somehow, I failed to take notice of that detail.

Around that same time, I had my annual physical as well as a routine check-up with my cardiologist. Both doctors kindly but firmly told me I need to be regularly exercising. The benefits in doing so are numerous, and the risks in not exercising could be serious. While I heard their words, I did not do much to take their advice. Both these issues kind of got pushed onto a "back burner" in my mind.

Just after Labor Day I was at the gas station. I was debating with myself as to what button to push for which grade of gas. Could I cheat and go for regular? Would 89 octane be a good compromise? Suddenly, it was like someone hit me over the head with a wave of common sense. What are you thinking? Your doctors are telling you to take care of yourself, and you are putting more energy and focus into what kind of gas to buy. You can always fix or replace a broken car. There is no replacing a healthy body and sometimes repairs can be difficult. On that early autumn morning, I had a moment of insight that took place at pump #4 at Cumberland Farms (I like to refer to it as Cucumber Farms.)

In an instant, I had determination; it is time to start exercising. I dusted off my membership card to LA Fitness, which had gone unused for too many years. I figured times in my calendar to make this work, and it has become part of my routine. (I waited until now to write about it to make sure it was not just a passing idea.) It was a holy moment in coming to a deeper appreciation for God's gift of the body and our ability to care for what He has given. Insights into the power of God and the mystery of our lives can come about in unusual ways and at unexpected times.

I like my primary physician, and I have a good cardiologist. I have a spiritual director and others who help keep me on track. All of these folks led me to make a choice for the better in one area of how I live my life. I am grateful for their guidance and the gift of the Spirit that has put me on that path.

By the way, I also have a good mechanic. And, if Fred from Lakeview says use premium unleaded, I use premium unleaded. My car has not stalled yet, and neither have I.
