

Kitchen Capers

I would like to share with you some info and tidbits about the newly renovated kitchen at the Parish House.

First of all, thank you. It was parish money that paid for most of the project, and I am most grateful. You would think that spending people's money would be easy and fun. It was actually quite challenging. While I wanted something nice, and I didn't want to take shortcuts, I was very conscious of budget. I am happy to report the cost of the renovation was \$5.57 short of \$30,000. Initial estimates were well over \$40,000, so I am pleased the renovation cost far less than that. The original plan was to replace the flooring only in the kitchen. But, it quickly became apparent that the flooring in the living and dining rooms was beyond repair. So, in the end, over 800 square feet of vinyl planking were installed.

It was pointed out to me that the kitchen would not face the same level of use that a kitchen for a family of six would incur. Because of that, I did not need to get super-duper cabinets. I was assured that one of the more basic models would serve well. And, the Diocese has a great contract with P.C Richard which equated to a substantial discount on the appliances.

My favorite story of savings was the backsplash. I wanted some glass tiles with vibrant color. I found something at a local tile store that I liked, but it cost \$92 a square foot. Although I did not need a lot of that tile, it was expensive. Even the salesman was shocked at the price. One day I went into lower Manhattan to the "lighting district" on the Bowery to look for pendant lights. In the midst of electrical stores, there was one tile shop. They had a glass tile that I loved, and the cost was only \$17 a square foot. It took me two trips into the city while hauling a box of tiles home on the LIRR, but it was all part of the adventure.

I knew I was in good hands through the whole project. A parishioner who does this professionally was the contractor and did fine work, keeping right on schedule; it took three weeks from start to finish.

I was able to use the kitchen for Christmas Eve to make a nice dinner for some friends. And, it has gotten a few good workouts since. I had fun on New Year's Day by myself. I like being creative in the kitchen, and I like food that has a little "attitude" (spice). I decided I would make a nice breakfast of huevos rancheros. I looked up a recipe, did all the shopping, and I was off and running. I think this was the most complicated recipe I ever tried. At one point, I had three separate frying pans going. I enjoyed the dish, but they did not taste at all like any huevos rancheros I have ever ordered in a restaurant. By the time I was done, the place looked like a bomb exploded. It was an hour of prep, and almost as long to clean up, all for two eggs. It was a bit crazy, but I had a few laughs along the way.

I am most appreciative to have a new kitchen to enjoy!

Homeschooling Targeted:

In Virginia, the Loudoun County Public School Board is seeking State legislation to repeal the religious exemption which permits thousands of home-schooling parents to opt out of the public school system. Families will be required to find "an alternative instruction setting," to insure a "satisfactory education." And the District – not the parent – would determine what a "satisfactory education" looks like.

"This action is very disturbing. It means that the school district wants new ways to control religious-exempt families," said the Senior Counsel to the Home School Legal Defense Foundation.

Religious Schools Targeted:

In New York, leaders of religious schools are alarmed by the new guidelines from the State's Dept. of Education that give local public school boards broad power to oversee and intrude upon the independence of private religious schools. Ed Mechmann, spokesman for the N.Y. Archdiocese wrote, "There is no protection against government officials who are hostile to religious schools or who just want to eliminate the competition."

"As those first responsible for the education of their children, parents have the right to choose a school for them which corresponds to their own convictions. This right is fundamental." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, Par. 2229)
