Something Red, Orange, and Purple

Msgr. Nelson Perez was a parish priest in the suburbs of Philadelphia. In 2012 the Holy Father named him a bishop. This is sometimes referred to within Church circles as “getting a red hat.” (Actually, cardinals tend to wear the red hats; the bishops’ hats are more of a magenta color.) From there, he was assigned to be one of the auxiliary bishops here in Rockville Centre. Once he was ordained a bishop, he began to serve our Diocese in 2012. Bishop Perez celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation at Holy Cross in 2016. In 2017 he was named Ordinary (head bishop) for the Diocese of Cleveland. Last month, the Holy Father named him to become Archbishop of Philadelphia, his hometown. His installation was this week. He is a humble, caring, and holy man. He is a charismatic and prophetic leader. This is good news for the Church. Congratulations, Archbishop Perez!

I am now driving around in a different set of wheels. I had a Honda Civic Si that was a fun car in which to zip around town. I owned it for almost two years and slowly came to the conclusion that it was just a little too small for me. After a bit of homework and discernment, I arrived at the decision I wanted to replace it with a Nissan Rogue. I have quirky tastes when it comes to cars (and probably other things as well). They make that SUV in a really nifty bright orange. I not only wanted an orange one, but it had to have a sunroof as well. The sheer number of people coming on Wednesday gives witness to this. We need to embrace the darkness and shadow of our lives. We all can recognize the necessity for some kind of discipline, sacrifice, or practice that helps us to become stronger people and grow closer to God. Think and pray about what it is that God may be calling you to during this holy season.

ASHES & ASH WEDNESDAY



On **Wednesday, February 26th**, countless Christians will be signed with ashes on their forehead. This symbolizes the beginning of our **40 Day Journey through Lent**. As this significant day in the life of Christians arrives, we wonder **WHY ARE WE RECEIVING ASHES?** We must be careful not to judge others' intentions, but we are challenged to reflect on our own motives for being blessed with ashes.

Beginning Lent with the Sign of the Cross is meant to remind us of our Baptism when the priest, along with our parents and godparents, traced the Sign of the Cross on our forehead, saying, "In the name of the Christian community, I claim you for Christ our Savior by the Sign of the Cross."

- **Ashes have been considered a sign of penance.**
- **Christ is the beginning and the end of our life's journey.**
- **We are called to internal conversion and change of heart.**
- **We consciously are entering into the central mystery of our faith...
that the way to Resurrection is by way of the Cross.**

WHY RECEIVE ASHES? Ashes are meant to be an external sign of our interior desire to make these 40 days of Lent a special and sacred time. We begin Lent with ashes, reminding us of our need to die to anything that keeps us from growing in the love of God. At the Easter Vigil we will receive lighted candles reminding us that "If we die with Christ, we shall rise with Him into future glory."

"Repent, and believe in the Gospel."

Children and Ashes...



Our 4:00 and 5:30 PM services will be more "child friendly." These services will be shorter, with a homily geared to a child's understanding. This will enable the children to enter into the spirit of Lent in a manner appropriate for their age.

Fast and Abstinence

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.



SPECIAL COLLECTION

Next weekend, at the offertory, we will also be collecting for "The Church in Need." The monies collected at this time will be shared among three areas of the world where there is a particular need for help:

- **Church in Central and Eastern Europe** - This collection supports the Church in more than 20 countries that still struggle to recover from Communist rule. Funds from this collection support pastoral care, catechesis, building renovations, and seminary formation.
- **The Church in Latin America** - For many in Latin America and the Caribbean, a rising secular culture, difficult rural terrain, and a shortage of ministers all present obstacles to practicing the faith. Your support for the collection provides lay leadership training, catechesis, priestly and religious formation, and other programs to share our Catholic faith with those who long to hear the Good News of Christ.
- **The Church in Africa** - Although the Church in Africa is growing, many still lack access to basic resources and pastoral care. Many suffer due to high rates of poverty and unemployment, illiteracy, and poor education. The Solidarity Fund supports pastoral projects that foster lasting peace and reconciliation in a continent often marked by division and tension.
