I Didn't Know the Thermometer Went that Low

As you read this article, I have a tinge of guilt as I am away enjoying a winter get-away in warmth and sunshine. Mother Nature has certainly delivered a wicked winter punch to much of our nation.

Although most of the ground is harder than concrete with the deep freeze we have experienced, I am asking you to think of tilling soil and working out in the garden. As you know, for about eight years Holy Cross has maintained a Community Garden. The primary purpose of the garden is to raise produce that can be distributed to our Parish Outreach clients. This has been a successful undertaking and much appreciated by those who have benefitted from it. However, we find ourselves in need of additional helpers. We always have an abundance of helping hands for the spring kick-off or the autumn clean-up, and there are times throughout the year when the Boy Scouts or other groups will assist with weeding or other large projects. The difficulty is in having enough hands to help with picking the produce and other smaller tasks that need to be done on an almost daily basis. The core group of volunteers has gotten smaller through the years, and for some, their backs are not as strong as they once were. Please let me know if you think you might want to donate your green thumb for a few hours each week this summer. Planning for this summer's garden is underway.

This week there was a Pastoral Council meeting. One of the topics that was discussed was reverence or silence before Mass. It was a topic that had mixed opinions, and no decisions were made. There are some folks who enjoy being able to see and chat with friends and neighbors before Mass. It is part of the personality of Holy Cross to be a personable and caring community. There are others who look for quiet time and reflection before Mass begins and sometimes find the chatter to be a distraction. The best I can do at the moment is to say that parishioners have different expectations and to be conscious of those who are around you.

I am always appreciative of my brother priests who are willing to assist in covering Masses on those occasions when I am away. Msgr. Joe Curley, who is the retired Pastor from the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church in Centereach, has been a good friend to Holy Cross. Through my years here, he has been able to take most of the weekday Masses when I am away. However, this week is likely going to be the last time he will be able to assist us. Within the next few weeks, he is scheduled to move to Pius X, which is the retired priests' residence in Amityville. We are grateful for all the ways in which he has been a part of life at Holy Cross. We wish him well as he begins this new chapter in his journey. God bless you Fr. Joe and thank you.





Our homebound folks receive friendly telephone calls by Outreach volunteers to keep up the connection and to assess ways the parish can be present to these loved parishioners. At Advent and Easter time a volunteer will visit them and bring a gift from the parish community. Eucharistic Ministers are also available to bring communion to the homebound who desire it.

Brian Buescher, a U.S. District Court nominee was assailed by some senators for his membership in the Knights of Columbus, a Catholic charitable organization, suggesting this affiliation might disqualify him for judgeship. Wrote Archbishop Charles Chaput (PA), "The sheer ignorance, not to mention injustice, in the senators describing the K of C as 'extreme' would be baffling – if it weren't part of a pattern of bigoted thinking already sanctified by other senators in their vulgar 2017 grilling of now-judge Amy Coney Barrett. As in 'The dogma lives loudly within you and that's a concern,' said Sen. Diane Feinstein (CA) to Ms. Coney Barrett."

Rev. Eugene Rivers, a Pentecostal minister, decried the "anti-Catholic bigotry" shown by the senators. "As a leader of black Christians, I feel particularly strongly about the Knights of Columbus. For more than a century they bravely defended minorities. If Catholics like the Knights can be targeted, what should members of my Pentecostal Church expect? What about Orthodox Jews, Muslims, Mormons and Evangelical Christians? We share traditional views on abortion and marriage. Even the Rev. Martin Luther King's biblical beliefs would be anathema to these Senators."

"It's ugly, it's vindictive, and it damages all of us," said Archbishop Chaput about these hostile attacks on religious faith among the nation's leading legislators.
