Two weeks ago, I wrote about the Pastoral Team attending the Religious Education Congress in Anaheim, California. There are six of us who have made the journey to the West Coast. I shared with you some of the reasons why I felt this was a worthwhile endeavor. There is one more reason I share with you now. This weekend attracts approximately 40,000 people who are immersed in various ministries within the Catholic Church. It is exciting and energizing to be surrounded by so many people who are happy and passionate about ministry within the Church. It is an occasion where we can experience the best of what the Church can offer. We are blessed and privileged for this experience and to be bearers of this good news to so many.

It is no secret that the Church finds herself in the midst of stormy waters. The shadow side of the Church is readily identified. There are many reasons one could give why it is hard to be part of the Church; there is still a great need for healing and restoring trust. But, the underlying reality is that for so many, in spite of all the flaws, the Church is still a place of life. It is where we experience the Sacraments, which none of us could share in apart from her. It is where there are opportunities for spiritual growth, friendship, and life within our local community. Holy Cross is a perfect example of this. The parish is a place where the mystery of our Lord comes to life. Great and holy things can continue to be accomplished locally. We are called to the place we find life, so in turn, we can be instruments of life and hope to others.

The Church is both global and local. We more readily identify with the local Church. But, that does not mean we can remove ourselves from the universal Church. In spite of her human failings, we are part of this great institution. At the moment, we find ourselves in the season of Lent which precedes the most solemn days of Holy Week. This is not something we do alone as a parish community, rather we join countless others who embrace these traditions.

We are grateful to all those who give in different ways to support Holy Cross. May we continue to make this a vibrant and joyful community. And, may we also pray for the wider Church. At times it may feel like we are in a tug of war in our relationship with the Church. It is a two-edged sword that at times sustains us and other times challenges us. May we allow the Spirit to touch her and each of us as we grow together.

 for some families struggling to make ends meet.




- Rather than having your Starbucks or Dunkin' Donuts


