

# The Wonder of a Good Night's Sleep

I am blessed. I'm blessed in many ways, but for whatever reason this week I was particularly aware that a good night's sleep is a blessing from God. Not everyone can get a restful night. I know that my mother struggled with insomnia; her nights were long and difficult. I'm sure there are parents who long for a full night of sleep, but a newborn infant or a child with a stomach virus comes first. Caretakers of someone who is sick have the same experience. There are those who work long days, have more than one job or simply have so much to do, they are barely able to squeeze in a few hours of rest. Most nights I am blessed to be able to sleep soundly for six hours or so.

This Christmas, Santa brought me a Fitbit. I'm sure many of you have had one for many years; I'm not exactly up on the cutting edge of technology. For those of you who don't know, it is a device worn on the wrist that looks like a watch. It keeps track of the number of steps taken each day. It can be used to monitor how much you eat and drink and how many calories you expend in the course of the day. There is one feature in particular that fascinates me. If I wear the Fitbit when I go to sleep, it monitors sleep patterns through the night. The next morning I can look at a graph on my iPhone that distinguishes between light sleep, REM, and deep sleep. It is intriguing to see the complexity of what is at work during a night of sleep. God created an amazing design to allow our bodies to rest and renew itself in the course of a few hours. It is remarkable that we now have the ability to see the intricacy with which God created all that He did.

It is my understanding that all people have dreams, but not everyone remembers them with the same degree of clarity. Dreams are ways in which the inner psyche can process issues that might get buried deeply inside during our waking hours. Dreams can bring to the forefront questions and issues we may be worried about or need to be addressed with greater attention. There are certainly Scripture stories where God has used the occasion of a dream to reveal His plan and presence in the lives of people. (Hopefully, my homilies are not occasions for you to have dreams during Mass 😊). I have had many occasions where God spoke to me through my dreams. Sometimes it takes some thought and discernment to decipher what the message is, but they can offer profound insight into our lives.

Admittedly, this may have been one of my more unusual columns. It was a slow news week in terms of parish life. Have a great week. Rest well and have pleasant dreams. Zzzz . . .

Remember, Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. Try to come up with a plan or discipline that will allow the days of Lent to be a holy time for you.

# ASHES & ASH WEDNESDAY



On **Wednesday, March 6th**, countless Christians will be signed with ashes on their forehead. This symbolizes the beginning of our **40 Day Journey through Lent**. As this significant day in the life of Christians arrives, we wonder **WHY ARE WE RECEIVING ASHES?** We must be careful not to judge others' intentions, but we are challenged to reflect on our own motives for being blessed with ashes.

Beginning Lent with the Sign of the Cross is meant to remind us of our Baptism when the priest, along with our parents and godparents, traced the Sign of the Cross on our forehead, saying, "In the name of the Christian community, I claim you for Christ our Savior by the Sign of the Cross."

- **Ashes have been considered a sign of penance.**
- **Christ is the beginning and the end of our life's journey.**
- **We are called to internal conversion and change of heart.**
- **We consciously are entering into the central mystery of our faith... that the way to Resurrection is by way of the Cross.**

**WHY RECEIVE ASHES?** Ashes are meant to be an external sign of our interior desire to make these 40 days of Lent a special and sacred time. We begin Lent with ashes, reminding us of our need to die to anything that keeps us from growing in the love of God. At the Easter Vigil we will receive lighted candles reminding us that "If we die with Christ, we shall rise with Him into future glory."

**"Repent, and believe in the Gospel."**

7 AM, 9 AM Mass, 12 Noon, 4 PM, 5:30 PM & 7 PM.**

## Children and Ashes...

Our 4:00 and 5:30 PM services will be more "child friendly." These services will be shorter, with a homily geared to a child's understanding. This will enable the children to enter into the spirit of Lent in a manner appropriate for their age.

## **Fast and Abstinence...**

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.



# PARISH OUTREACH

## Long Island Cares Food Drive

Who are the hungry on Long Island? We share some facts compiled by Long Island Cares:

- Approximately 316,000 Long Island residents are hungry or food insecure. That is more than 1 in every 9 people.
- 89,030 of these Long Islanders are children. They must rely on others to access the feeding programs and services they need.
- The elderly make up 4% of Long Island's hungry. Some of the reasons for this are: not having enough income to afford nutritious food; suffering from depression and loneliness; experiencing the side effects of medications. Many are too proud to request help.
- Nearly half - 48% - receiving emergency food assistance are the "working poor"; households that include at least one employed adult. More than two out of every four people seeking food assistance report having to choose between paying for food and paying the rent or mortgage. More than one out of three must choose between food and medicine or medical care.

As we have done for the last few years during Lent and as part of our Baptismal call to live out the Beatitudes, our parish will sponsor a food drive on behalf of Long Island Cares. **Last year our parish food drive provided 605 pounds of donated items to Long Island Cares.** Long Island Cares is an organization that collects and delivers food to more than 600 community-based agencies in Nassau and Suffolk. In a typical year, it distributes over 7 million pounds of food.

Please bring your **non-perishable food items** to **Mass on the weekend of March 16/17** and place them in the large boxes in the Atrium.

We thank you for being a community that consistently stocks our own food pantry, reaches out to our surrounding communities and finds ways to assist our global family (through Heifer International).

# RELIGIOUS FREEDOM



## "GHOULISH" NEW LAW

Calling New York State's newly expanded abortion law "ghoulish," Cardinal Timothy Dolan explained that the new law: allows for an abortion right up to the moment of birth; drops all charges against an abortionist who allows an aborted baby, who somehow survives, to die before his eyes; mandates that, to make an abortion more convenient and easy, a physician need not perform it, and the law might even be used to suppress the conscience rights of health care professionals not to assist in the grisly procedures.

The law proclaims that: Every individual has the "fundamental right" to choose to have an abortion. The phrase, "fundamental right" is extremely significant since it incorporates the constitutional law principle that these "rights" cannot be regulated except in the most narrow way possible.

Therefore, the language of the law poses a direct threat to religious freedom and conscience rights. It gives the state the authority to deny licenses to individuals and institutions that do not provide or cooperate with abortion.

Research shows that unborn babies feel pain by 20 weeks, and most even earlier. The United States is now one of only seven out of the 198 nations in the world to allow abortion on demand past 20 weeks. The other six are North Korea, China, Vietnam, Singapore, Canada and Netherlands.
