Last weekend, the Pastoral Team attended the Religious Education Congress in Anaheim, California. It was a rich and amazing experience. As I wrote about in the bulletin, it is remarkable to see tens of thousands of people who are passionate about ministry within the Church. There were parts of the weekend we attended together, such as the Opening Ceremony and Mass on Saturday evening. Between all of us, we attended over two dozen workshops. Some were educational, some were more inspirational, but all provided food for thought for our respective ministries. We now have the task of discerning all that we experienced and figuring a way to incorporate some of what we gained into the life at Holy Cross. Some of the things might be more immediate, such as introducing a new song or two. Some may take more time to implement. We are most grateful to the parish for supporting this undertaking and look forward to the new life it may bring to Holy Cross.

I am happy to announce that we have someone to take the role of our Youth Minister. Ms. Allie Roecklein will be carrying on in this work. Allie is a familiar face here at Holy Cross. She has been part of the Youth Ministry's Core Group for 10 years. She has served on the Pastoral Council as well as at Mass as a Eucharistic Minister. She brings with her the knowledge and skills that are necessary for this job. She has worked well with the Core Group for years, so there can be a continuation of that same spirit that has been successful for so long. I appreciate her willingness to step up and embrace this leadership position; I am confident in her ability to do great work. Holy Cross is blessed to have our Youth Ministry program. It offers a rich opportunity for our young people to not only have fun, but to be enriched in the faith. Thank you to our Core Group who work long and hard to serve the youth of our parish.





Highlights of Quarter:

- Collections are the same this quarter compared to this time last year.
- Our Christmas collection was \$38,600 which is down \$7,060 from last year's Christmas collection.
- Cash Calendar ticket sales created a surplus of \$4,390 which is up from last quarter.
- Salary expense has increased. Employees were given a cost of living raise. Additional hours were allocated for maintenance.
- Total building maintenance expense has increased \$4,100 due to repairs to the heating system and increased heating bills. This prompted us to switch to another heating and air conditioning company, saving \$3,100 annually.
- Although there were decreases in some areas of income we were able to bring expenses down to realize a surplus of \$15,130.
- Work is starting this spring to install automated handicapped doors at the atrium entrance. When completed, cost should total less than \$10,000.
