# A Blessed Holy Week

Before I offer my “holy thoughts” for the week, I would like to offer a word of gratitude to all who supported our Annual Basket Raffle. We are grateful to all the ministries and individual parishioners who made each and every basket. Thank you to all of you who took a chance and bought some tickets. And finally, thank you to our Fundraising Committee who took care of the many details of this undertaking. We appreciate the support of everyone.

This has been a busy Lenten season here at Holy Cross. Over 80 people enjoyed the Soup Supper last week. Dr. Tom Petriano spoke beautifully of how silence is the gateway to God speaking in our lives. Not only did we hear inspiring words, but we had 10 different soups to choose from. And, one was better than the next.

There have been other spiritual opportunities as well. We had 26 parishioners participate in the directed retreat which consisted of individual weekly meetings with a Spiritual Director. For many parishioners this was something they had never done before, and it was well received. An additional 36 people are participating in the Awakening Faith program which continues into the spring. We also had Eucharistic Adoration on Fridays throughout Lent. We tried to make our Sunday celebrations different than the rest of the year. We sang the Our Father, and we had our closing procession in silence. We also used the song “Sacred Silence” at every Mass to help remind us of the invitation to silence. All of these experiences were in addition to whatever personal practices you chose to do for the days of Lent. I hope these days have been prayerful and reflective for you.

As many of you know, I like planning trips. For me, planning is almost as much fun as the trip itself. When I bring a group of people to see some point of interest, I try to ensure they have the very best time. I want folks to have as full of an experience as possible. I look at these days before Holy Week from the same perspective. I'm not planning a trip to some destination, but I am going to be leading people through the most holy days of our year. I am going to be part of an experience which I hope, in some ways, brings people closer to God. Our solemn celebrations afford us the opportunity to understand how the Paschal Mystery touches our lives. These can be profound encounters with God.

As much as I would get a kick out of being a tour guide, it is a far deeper privilege I have as a priest to do the holy work that I do. Not everyone has the ability or means to travel to distant places. But, to be able to bring the power of God here to our community is great work. I pray that these days are rich moments in prayer where the presence of the Lord is made known to you. Blessed and prayerful days to all.

## Holy Land Collection

**On Good Friday, our parish will take up the annual Good Friday Collection for the Holy Land.** Each day, the news reminds us of the violence and instability plaguing the Middle East, but we rarely hear of the shrinking Christian community there, a community that struggles to remain in the land of Christ's birth, death and resurrection. This Pontifical Collection allows the Franciscans and others to continue caring for Christianity's holiest sites and for God's people in the Holy Land. Thank you for supporting this important collection!

## Reminder on Fasting

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday**. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal may be taken during the day.

# RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

## Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2019-2020 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register**. If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Our program is "home based." Classes do not take place at the Church; rather they are held in the homes of our Catechists. Because of this, there are geographical limits on who we are able to accommodate. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- First time registration needs to be done in person at our office.
- Registration needs to be completed by June 14, 2019.
- Office Hours: Monday – Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to bring a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. Materials will be sent to your home by the end of April and they may be returned by mail. Please note the deadline of June 14, 2019.

A detailed outline of our program is available on-line or at our office. But, there are a few important details to be noted.

- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is, this is only one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist.



The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.
