

## THE LONG AND WINDING ROAD

This is the Third Sunday of Easter. Last year, on this Sunday, we heard the famous Gospel story of the Road to Emmaus. At that time, we were in the midst of the lockdown. As a prelude before Mass began that Sunday, we started the livestream on Nichols Road, walked up the driveway and into the Worship Area to the melody of the Beatles' "Long and Winding Road." It seemed like an appropriate way to introduce the theme for the day.

At that time, the sentiment of being on a long road was felt by all. It was a bleak and dreary day when we made that recording. Nichols Road was deserted. The weather and the setting reflected our spirits. It felt like we were in the middle of a long and winding journey, with no end in sight. We have come a long way, but the journey continues. For some there is newness of life and optimism. For others there are still challenges that need to be dealt with. Although this year the gospel is different, the story of the Road to Emmaus reminds us that Jesus always journeys with us, even if we don't always recognize him. And certainly, in the breaking of the bread, we are reminded of his presence.

This past week we had some spirit-filled gatherings for our young people in our Level 8 (Confirmation) program. It was a collaboration between our Religious Ed Office and Youth Ministry. There are many rich and spiritual opportunities that are part of our Youth Ministry program. But there is also a lot of fun that is had along the way. These evenings included a bit of each of those aspects (and even some s'mores to snack on). We are hopeful that many of our young people will maintain their connection to the parish through Youth Ministry. I am grateful to the many helping hands that created these fruitful evenings.

Also this weekend, we are conducting our pre-Cana program for our engaged couples. Normally we offer one program in the spring. However, this year because of the need to have smaller groups, and an increase in the number of marriages that will be celebrated, we will offer a second weekend program later in May. There is life which abounds.

This coming week I begin my annual appointed rounds as Dean. I need to visit the surrounding parishes and verify that their sacramental records are being maintained properly. The paperwork itself is a bit tedious. But I do enjoy visiting the other parishes. Each community has its own charism, and the life of the Church is carried on in a variety of ways.

Whether you are on a long straightaway or in the midst of some hairpin turns in life, know that the gift of the Risen Lord is offered to you. Receive his comfort, his healing life, and know that you are never alone.

### **LITURGY BYTES**

Did you ever hear anyone say, "The Mass is boring. I don't get anything out of it"? Some might say their children have echoed those sentiments on occasion, and others might have admitted they themselves uttered those words too. Since we are experiencing the beautiful 50 days of the Easter season, I thought a reflection of discovery, pointing out four points about Mass, might be helpful.



Did you ever hear that much of the "boredom" stems from ignorance? Many do not know what Church is all about. At least, that has been my experience. My husband always said the more he learned about Church, the less boring it became.

Back in the **second century**, the Christians had a distinct form of worship, much like what we are familiar with today. Those Christians listened to readings from some of the writings of the Apostles, followed by the presider's instruction (homily). Then the bread and wine were presented and shared; prayers and thanksgivings were also offered. Isn't it amazing to know that the basic structure of the Mass has been maintained for over 1900 years! Wherever the Christian faith spread, Sunday worship would ultimately be anchored in two parts: the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Sound familiar???

Please come back next week for the next installment in helping to "get more out of the Mass" and/or for a few tips to guide family and friends to a better understanding of the most important hour of our lives.



Parish Outreach sends cards, on behalf of our parish, to those who are ill or hospitalized. Our homebound folks receive friendly telephone calls by Outreach volunteers to keep up the connection and to assess ways the parish can be present to these loved parishioners. At Advent and Easter time a volunteer will visit them and bring a gift from the parish community. Eucharistic Ministers are also available to bring communion to the homebound who desire it.

### BACKGROUND SCREENING UPDATE

## The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People:

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (The Charter) promulgated by the Bishops of the United States in 2002 outlines specific practices and guidelines providing standards of safety in parishes and dioceses throughout the United States. As directed in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre requires all employees, clergy, and volunteers to complete three requirements within thirty days of employment or volunteering:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children Program (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screen application. The Diocese requires all those who remain in active ministry be rescreened at 5-year intervals. volunteers/employees.

#### A Word on Background Screening of Volunteers:

The Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (OFPCYP) has streamlined the volunteer application process enabling volunteers to complete the three safe environment requirements in one step. Individuals wishing to volunteer in a parish or school:

- 1. Register to attend a Protecting God's Children class and create a Virtus account on the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org
- 2. Electronically acknowledge the Diocesan Code of Conduct provided during the Virtus registration process.
- 3. Follow the instructions to complete the Sterling Volunteers background screening application offered during the Virtus registration process.

#### **Active Volunteers:**

If you are active in a parish ministry, have already attended Virtus and have been background screened, you may be at - or beyond - the *5yr. rescreening requirement*. If this is the case, you will receive an email from *Sterling Volunteers* asking you to complete the background screening application online. You may access the background screening application by following the prompt in the email or logging into your Virtus account. *Please be aware - this is not a scam nor has your email been hacked.* The OFPCYP has been working with your parish to update the Safe Environment records and noted it is time for you to be rescreened. You may also be prompted to electronically re-sign the Code of Conduct when you log into your Virtus account.

#### **Edit Your Virtus Account:**

To access your Virtus account <a href="www.Virtus.org">www.Virtus.org</a> you will need your Username and Password. If you need assistance, please contact Virtus: 1-888-847-8870 or <a href="helpdesk@virtus.org">helpdesk@virtus.org</a>. Once in your account, review your account information - particularly your email address. If your account requires updating, please hit the TOOLBOX tab at the top of the screen. On the left side of your screen, in the green column, click "Update My Account." You will be able to make the necessary changes. Please remember to hit the SAVE button at the bottom of the screen.

## WHAT'S NEW?

### Spring Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to Covid. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "Spring Cash Fling." This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.

- \$10 per ticket
- Tickets are available for purchase through March, April, and May.
- Drawing will be held in May.

Because we anticipate smaller participation, there will be a different pay scale:

- \* 1 Prize @ \$250
- \* 2 Prizes @ \$100
- \* 10 Prizes @ \$50
- \* 15 Prizes @ \$25



- This formula was based upon selling 250 tickets @ \$10 each. If more than 250 tickets are sold, the number of prizes will be increased. (In the event the response is strong, we will resume a monthly drawing as soon as possible.)
- Tickets will not be sold after Mass. Please use the tear-off tickets below. You may return your entries by placing them in an envelope and depositing it in the basket on weekends, or returning them to the Parish Office.
