

We have begun the great celebration of Easter. One of the wonders of the annual celebration of Christ's Resurrection is that it reminds us, the gift of life our Savior brought was not a one-time event. New life and hope continue to unfold. Sometimes these revelations happen in our individual or family lives, and sometimes they happen within our parish community. Once again, I am reporting some significant changes in our staffing here at Holy Cross.

Kathleen Reid joined Holy Cross in October of 2017. She recently decided that it is time for her to begin the next chapter of her life, which is called retirement. Although Kathleen has been with us only two years, she has spent her entire professional career working for the Church. For over forty-one years she has dedicated her life to Religious Education. She has served in several parishes as Director of Religious Education for children as well as coordinated faith formation programs for adults. It has been a privilege that we were part of her lifelong service to the Church. We thank her for her contribution here at Holy Cross and wish her the best as she moves forward. She will continue to serve here through the end of June.

Finding a qualified person to run a Religious Education program is not easy. But, happily we did not need to look any further than our own office. Last summer we hired Tricia Clarke as our Business Manager. Although she has served splendidly in this role, her true passion is Religious Education. Her educational background is in this field, and she continues to work towards her Master's Degree. She has 28 years of experience as a Catechist working in varied capacities in programs in several communities. I am happy to announce that Tricia will take on the role of Coordinator of Religious Education in June. I am excited about the enthusiasm and vision she will bring to our program.

In November 2018, we hired Roberto Maza as a part-time Custodian. He quickly demonstrated himself to be an extraordinary employee. Recently, we were able to increase his hours so that he is now a full-time employee. The care of our facilities is in capable hands.

There are still a few more pieces that need to come together as we move forward with our staffing. We are working on them, and I look forward to sharing them with you in the coming weeks once all the details are finalized.

Our parish continues to grow, change, and take on new life. I am grateful for all the good works that have already happened through the efforts of so many caring people. I am excited for all the good things that await us as we move forward. The joy of the Risen Lord continues to bring us life and hope.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2019-2020 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register**. If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Our program is "home based." Classes do not take place at the Church; rather they are held in the homes of our Catechists. Because of this, there are geographical limits on who we are able to accommodate. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- First time registration needs to be done in person at our office.
- Registration needs to be completed by June 14, 2019.
- Office Hours: Monday – Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to bring a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. Materials will be sent to your home by the end of April and they may be returned by mail. Please note the deadline of June 14, 2019.

A detailed outline of our program is available on-line or at our office. But, there are a few important details to be noted.

- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is, this is only one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist.



The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.

You are strongly encouraged to receive this Sacrament if you are having upcoming surgery, are dealing with a chronic or debilitating illness, are suffering from addiction, mental health issues or frailty.

On the first Sunday of each month, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is offered after the 9:30 AM Mass. **Sunday, May 5th, is the next date the Anointing will be offered.**

Today it is referred to as the Universal Prayer, although through the years it has also been called the General Intercessions or The Prayer of the Faithful. The prayers that we currently use come about through a variety of ways. Sometimes we write our own. We also have several on-line resources and books that we use in creating the prayers for each week. Additionally, there is a parishioner who assists in writing them.



We are offering the opportunity for parishioners to suggest needs or intentions that could be prayed for at our weekend Masses. Identify issues within our world, nation, community or Church. This would not be the place to mention individual people or private prayers such as “for my cousin, Daisy.” (Our Petition Book in the atrium is available for these special intentions.) Please suggest any prayers you would like to see included in our worship. Keep the following guidelines in mind:

- Be succinct; the prayer needs to be limited to one or two short sentences.
- Normally prayers begin with “For.” *For our nation, . . .*
- This is not the place for prayers of gratitude. *In Thanksgiving for . . .*
- Prayers should not include any particular agenda or personal opinion.

Depending on how many requests we receive, we will try to include at least one intention per week. It may be necessary to edit the prayer so that its format is consistent with the other prayers.



RELIGIOUS FREEDOM



Confession and Its Seal of Secrecy is Under Attack

A new bill in California seeks to remove "penitential communications" - the most sacred relationship between clergy and penitent in a formal confession - from current law. If the CA legislature enacts this bill, Catholic priests, bound by Canon Law not to disclose the contents of a confession, could face criminal prosecution and imprisonment for refusing to comply.

Catholics believe that confession is between the penitent and Christ with the priest representing Christ and able to talk to, advise, counsel, or simply listen to the person. The penalty for any priest who divulges anything heard in confession is automatic excommunication.

Since 2003, the states that have tried to force clergy to violate the seal of confession are Maryland, Kentucky, Nevada, Florida, New Hampshire, and Louisiana. All introduced bills were eventually rejected and did not pass into law.
