REJOICE, HE IS RISEN

The pattern for celebrating the days of the Triduum is that on Good Friday we recall the Passion and death of Jesus on the cross. Then, three days later we celebrate his rising from the dead. This year is no different. But the lived experience feels far different for most of us. There are many who will argue that it was thirteen months ago when we experienced the cross. Now, after having endured a very long year, we are finally moving to that moment of joy and newness of life.

There are reasons to be hopeful. The numbers of those who are sick are greatly reduced. Many are receiving the vaccine. Businesses are returning to more normal operations. There are more opportunities for social interaction. It is good to have these changes and embrace the life they offer. But we need to be mindful that there are many who come to these days with broken and heavy hearts. There are those who lost loved ones to Covid. There are individuals and families whose financial security has been uprooted. There are those who bear the emotional weight of having been in isolation or separated from those they love. And, sadly, there are too many events of suffering, hatred and injustice that surround us. While we celebrate joy, hope and life this day, there are many who come who still feel sad and broken.

The Easter gospel proclaims, He is risen! But, when you carefully read the details of today's story, the grand total of those who initially comprehended what happened is only one. We hear of the beloved disciple, John, who understood: "...he saw and believed." This does not take away anything from the power of the resurrection story. It simply means not everyone came to experience it in the same way and at the same time. In the coming weeks we will hear more scripture stories of others who slowly came to understand and believe. We gather today as a people of faith to celebrate this great moment. But the power of the Risen Lord will unfold in our hearts in different ways and at different moments.

As we move forward, each of us continues to carry our hopes, prayers, dreams and worries. Just because the calendar says it is Easter may not necessarily mean that all our burdens are removed. There is hope to be found as we tell the story of our salvation. We are reminded that we share in that same great mystery of Christ: his dying and his rising. This is not the first time of hardship in history. As we journey forward we are reminded that we share in the experiences of countless others who have gone before us. And we share in that same gift of life that has brought hope and joy to the world.

May you and those you love share in the peace that comes this Easter day as we once again celebrate that *He is Risen*. Happy Easter!

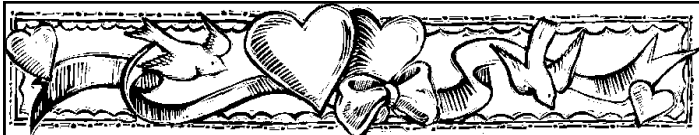

LITURGY BYTES

Easter—The Great 50 Days



Today we celebrate the most important day in the life of the Church – Easter – the Resurrection of Our Lord from the dead. We are even more excited this year because we are able to be together in person for Mass. If you recall, last year we were in lockdown, watching from home on our tablets, computers, or TVs. Somehow it did not seem like Easter in my opinion. However, we have much to be happy about this year as we return to a more normal pace, get vaccinated, and start to reconnect with family, friends, and our parish community.

Many refer to this time after Easter as the “great 50 days” which leads up to Pentecost – the birthday of the Church. Let’s look at how the celebration of this wonderful season began. Early Christians did not conceive of these days as “time-after” or “time between” Easter and Pentecost but rather a lengthy celebration of rejoicing in the resurrection, ascension, coming of the Spirit, and founding of the Church. These many facets all point to the mystery of Jesus as Lord and Savior. This unified understanding of the 50 days as one celebration emphasizes the need to maintain our Easter joy throughout the entirety of the season. Fortunately, where we live the daylight is longer, the weather getting warmer, and the emergence of blooming flowers makes it very easy to be joyful.

Within our worship space, liturgical colors are brighter with numerous colors of plants and flowers surrounding us. It is so very easy to greet one another with smiles. We sing the Gloria, and the Alleluia verse introduces the Gospel and completes the Dismissal rite at Mass. Have a happy and blessed Easter, everyone!

Spring Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to Covid. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "Spring Cash Fling." This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.

- \$10 per ticket
- Tickets are available for purchase through March, April, and May.
- Drawing will be held in May.

Because we anticipate smaller participation, there will be a different pay scale:

- * 1 Prize @ \$250
- * 2 Prizes @ \$100
- * 10 Prizes @ \$50
- * 15 Prizes @ \$25



- This formula was based upon selling 250 tickets @ \$10 each. If more than 250 tickets are sold, the number of prizes will be increased. *(In the event the response is strong, we will resume a monthly drawing as soon as possible.)*
- Tickets will not be sold after Mass. Please use the tear-off tickets below. You may return your entries by placing them in an envelope and depositing it in the basket on weekends, or returning them to the Parish Office.
