

# **Easter Blessings Continue**

In spite of unseasonably cool weather, our Holy Week and Easter celebrations were uplifting and inspiring. I love the energy that surrounds each of the days. In particular, on Easter it is always energizing to see so many people present. Attendance at all the services was higher than previous years. Both the 11:00 and 12:30 Masses on Sunday were standing room only.

I am grateful to all the many helping hands that came together to make these Holy Days as special as they were. Both our staff as well as many ministers work in cooperation in this effort. Our Worship Area is so beautifully decorated with bright flowers. It takes a great deal of creativity and skill to get all those plants in the right place (and then to keep them alive and blooming in the coming weeks). There are so many details, large and small, that need to be taken care of, and I appreciate all those who brought life to these celebrations. Many thanks.

One practical item that we need to evaluate is our modified Mass schedule for these days. In spite of our best efforts to communicate (parish wide mailing, website, bulletin notices, etc.) we had about 150 people show up on Palm Sunday for what they thought was an 11:30 Mass. It must be frustrating to arrive at what you think is the correct time only to find a different plan in place. Next year we will consider keeping the usual Sunday schedule and then adding the additional Mass at 1:00PM. I'm concerned that 1:00PM might be a tad late to start and 11:30AM will be overflowing, but it may be worth trying. We are trying to help people celebrate these holy days, not make life more complicated.

I think we all woke up on Monday morning to the dismay of another snowfall. We received the upper end of the predictions, and there was much more to shovel than we had hoped for. Unfortunately, this year will be a record setting one in terms of how much we have had to pay for plowing and keeping our pathways open and safe. This has been a rough winter for the trees as well. So many large branches broke free after being overloaded with wet snow. Both here at the parish and in many backyards in our neighborhood, the spring clean-up this year will be a major task.

Today is a particularly busy spiritual day here. In addition to the regular Masses, we have the Anointing of the Sick after the 9:30 Mass. Praying the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy will take place after the 11:30 Mass, followed by Confessions. And then to top the day off, I will baptize 4 babies at 2:00 PM. The Spirit abounds. Happy Easter!

# **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

### **Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education**

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2018-2019 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register.** If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Our program is "home based." Classes do not take place at the Church; rather they are held in the homes of our Catechists. Because of this, there are geographical limits on who we are able to accommodate. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- First time registration needs to be done in person at our office.
- Registration needs to be completed by June 15, 2018.
- Office Hours: Monday Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to bring a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. Materials will be sent to your home by the end of April and they may be returned by mail. Please note the deadline of June 15, 2018.

A detailed outline of our program is available on-line or at our office. But, there are a few important details to be noted.

- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is, this is only one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist.

The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.

Hello Everyone! Are you in high school? Do you want to make new friends as you play fun games and activities? Do you want to build more of an understanding about yourself and your faith?


If you answered "Yes!" to any one of those questions above, then you MUST check out the Holy Cross Youth Group! You will be glad you did!



#### **Highlights of Quarter and YTD:**

- Collections received through Automated Giving are up \$5,900 for the quarter. However, collections received through our regular Sunday collections have decreased \$5,700, therefore total collections are up only \$200 overall for the quarter. However, our Christmas collection increased almost \$8,000 over last year. Year to date we are up almost \$4,000.
- We received a one time gift from a parishioner's estate of \$40,000. (We also received a similar gift last year in the same quarter)
- Our payroll costs are lower this year due to a decrease in staffing in some departments.
- We incurred snow removal expenses of \$9,688 so far this fiscal year as compared to last year of \$6,706.
- Year to Date our surplus is almost \$30,000 vs. \$133,000 last year at this time. However, we did the parking lot repairs in this fiscal year.
- Surplus for the quarter was due to the Christmas collection and donation of \$40,000 in December 2017.

"Freedom of worship" means religious beliefs need to go "in the closet" – or into the four walls of a home or house of worship - and that faith should be a private affair, to be relegated to personal activities or weekend worship services.

"Freedom of religion" means religious believers can say and do as their conscience dictates in the public square. It includes freedom of worship but is also the right to evangelize, change their religion, have schools and charitable institutions, and conduct their jobs and businesses according to their conscience and religious beliefs.

The Founders were clear, and the Bill of Rights makes it foundational to our Constitution, that the government should not infringe on the free exercise of religion. Nevertheless, in recent years Americans have faced attempts to water down this robust understanding of religious freedom to a mere "freedom of worship."

"Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof." First Amendment to the Bill of Rights


