# **Happy Pentecost**

I have always enjoyed Pentecost. It is one of our great celebrations in the life of the Church. While it takes a back seat to Christmas and Easter in terms of attendance, it is still a day that can have great meaning for each of us individually as well as for the entire community.

I remember a silly event that happened years ago when I was assigned to St. Sylvester's in Medford. That year the parish was having a "ministry fair" with tables set up outside representing many of the ministries within the parish. There was hospitality offered, and people gathered together after Mass to enjoy the convivial spirit of the day. It was a beautiful spring day but very windy, and I came up with the creative idea of flying a kite over the courtyard. I thought it would add to the festive spirit. People got a kick out of watching me keep the kite in the air. Suddenly the wind subsided, and my kite no longer had any motivation to remain in the air. Within seconds it was diving towards the ground. I did my best to steer it away from unsuspecting parishioners. But, unfortunately, the Right to Life table took a direct hit. Thankfully no one was hurt, and aside from sending a few baby bottles and brochures flying in all directions there was no harm done. Since then, I have limited my celebratory salutations to activities that remain on level ground. (Isn't wisdom one of the gifts of the Spirit?)

There are many ways in which God offers each of us different gifts. Part of our spiritual journey is to understand what abilities God has given each of us and then discern how they are to be used. All God asks of us is to simply return to Him the gifts and treasures He has shared with us. Sometimes it takes the passing of time for us to understand the invitation God has offered us. It can be a moment of great joy and insight when we realize we are serving God by using what He has given to us. It is even a more remarkable thing when a community celebrates the gifts of many that enable the Church to carry on in its work. Thank you to all who share so generously their time and talent. We are a blessed community. We need to be open to the ways the Spirit will continue to be at work in our lives, calling us to be even a more vibrant community of faith.

On a personal note, thank you for all the thoughts and prayers many of you expressed to me last weekend on Mother's Day. It was a reflective day for me, but one that was filled with peace. I appreciate your kindness and thoughtfulness.

# **CELEBRATING PENTECOST!**



#### We Celebrate the Gifts of the Holy Spirit



Pentecost, the feast of the Holy Spirit, concludes the fifty day season of Easter. While we pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit to continue to flow upon our parish, we pause to celebrate the many ways the work of the Spirit has been evident in the Parish of the Holy Cross. As an example, *just in these last 50 days since Easter*:

- Over 100 Liturgical Ministers (Lectors, EMs, Ushers, Altar Servers, Musicians), in conjunction with our Liturgy Committee, helped to enhance our weekend Masses.
- 20 Catechists completed the preparation of 107 children to celebrate First Communion.
- 34 Catechists completed the preparation of 160 young people to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- 12 adults and a Boy Scout Troop prepared our Community Vegetable Garden for this year's crop.
- 20 musicians contributed their gifts to our Spring Concert.
- 45 individuals and parish groups donated baskets for our annual Basket Raffle.
- Dozens of parishioners and the members of our Hospitality Committee provided refreshments after the Easter Vigil and the Basket Raffle.
- Over 30 new parents were helped to prepare for the Baptism of their children by the 6 members of our Baptism Prep. Team.
- Consolation Ministers helped 4 families prepare for the funerals of their loved ones.
- Dozens of parishioners donated supplies for our Youth Group's Spring Retreat.
- 12 adult leaders conducted a weekend retreat for 22 young people in our Youth Group.
- 15 Prayer Blankets, sewn or knit by parishioners, were given to persons who are ill.
- 9 volunteers made home visits to deliver Easter flowers to the homebound.
- 12 Parish Outreach Core Workers met to plan our upcoming Blood Drive and School Supplies program.
- 40 parishioners continue to participate in the Alpha Program.
- 148 people have volunteered to help plan and implement our Parish Picnic in June.

All this in just 50 days!

## **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

#### **Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education**

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2018-2019 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register.** If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Our program is "home based." Classes do not take place at the Church; rather they are held in the homes of our Catechists. Because of this, there are geographical limits on who we are able to accommodate. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- First time registration needs to be done in person at our office.
- Registration needs to be completed by June 15, 2018.
- Office Hours: Monday Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to bring a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. Materials have been sent to your home early in May and they may be returned by mail. Please note the deadline of June 15, 2018.

A detailed outline of our program is available on-line or at our office. But, there are a few important details to be noted.

- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is, this is only one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist.

The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.

## MAY IS CYSTIC FIBROSIS AWARENESS MONTH

Cystic Fibrosis is the most common fatal INHERITED genetic disease with 1 in 29 people being an unknown symptomless carrier. CF is a multi-organ/system disease, chronic and progressive from birth.

While a person with CF may look healthy on the outside, the inside of the body is constantly fighting the disease. Germ control and food absorption are major components of the disease. Bio-film germs from water and soil thrive in the mucus throughout the body and neither immune responses nor antibiotics can reach them. In CF patients, it is infections from these germs that cause the loss of lung function, not the CF itself. Only 50% of people with CF live past the age of 18 with a median survival rate between 37 and 41.

For information on carrier screening please visit www.acog.org committee opinion 691. Newborn screening mandatory in this country, is NOT diagnostic NOR is it a carrier screening program. A healthy child in a family does not preclude another child from having CF or being a CF carrier. Genetic risk can be passed down for generations.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

I am writing to ask for your support in a critical matter.

As you may know, Fidelis Care, a non-profit health insurer that has served the poor and needy of New York, began operating in 1993 as the Catholic Health Services Plan of Brooklyn and Queens. In 1997, the eight bishops of the Catholic dioceses of New York, led by John Cardinal O'Connor, expanded Fidelis Care across the state to improve the health and wellness of underserved New Yorkers. It has become a model for managed care in the United States.

In recent years, however, it has become clear that the Church could better address the health and health-related needs of the underserved by exiting the increasing technology-driven insurance business and refocusing our efforts.

This is why, in September 2017, we announced that *Centene Corporation*, a national leader in providing managed care insurance plans, had agreed to buy the assets of *Fidelis Care*, so that the Church could continue to meet the health care needs of New Yorkers throughout the State in new and innovative ways.

Through consultation with philanthropy experts, it became clear that the best path forward was to establish a foundation to continue our mission of caring for New Yorkers in need and addressing social determinants of health outcomes. Therefore, the Catholic bishops have approved the creation of the *Mother Cabrini Health Foundation*, to undertake this critical new way of serving people of all faiths with their health and health-related needs.

The transaction has been approved by the New York Department of Health and the New York Department of Financial Services. A review by the New York Office of the Attorney General marks the final phase of approval. Once approved, the Foundation can begin initial grantmaking activity to communities and organizations throughout New York State, issuing grants totaling up to \$150M annually.


