Hoping for May Flowers

We certainly had an abundance of April showers; now all we need to do is wait for the May flowers to follow. It would also be nice if we had a little more warmth and sunshine, but it will happen soon enough I suppose. The signs of spring always bring a wave of new life with them.

I did not yet have the opportunity to express my gratitude to all those who made our Holy Week and Easter celebrations as beautiful as they were. There is an abundance of planning and prep work that goes into these busy days. I am grateful for all those who served, decorated and offered a helping hand to bring our holiest days to life. As much as we acknowledge our efforts in putting these days together, it is truly the gift of the Spirit that brings life to the celebrations. Sometimes the Spirit works in cooperation with our good efforts. And, sometimes the Spirit fills in the gaps where we may have forgotten a detail or two. It is all good, and we are blessed to have moments like these in our journey of faith.

The one part of our Easter celebration that needs attention in the future is the 1:00PM Mass. Palm Sunday and Easter draw especially large numbers of people. We need an additional Mass to handle all the worshipers. Previously, we created a special Mass schedule that was different than our regular schedule. As much as we publicized the Mass times, many folks would show up at the usual times which caused frustration and confusion. This year we tried something different by simply adding a Mass. I was concerned that 1:00PM was too late, but we had well over 200 people attend. The difficulty was we did not have the ministers to serve. A handful of faithful regulars ran around and tried to cover all the bases. Unfortunately, I think we gave the impression that we were ill-prepared for the Mass. We want to put our best foot forward on these special days. Moving forward we will need to be sure we have adequate coverage for the Mass. This will take some coordination and organization even before we announce our Mass schedule.

I am happy to report I have uncovered the top of my desk. In the days leading up to Holy Week, I look at the work on my desk and say, "I'll work on that after Easter." Unfortunately, the pile grows to an alarming height, and it takes some time to whittle away at it once Easter has passed. But, the good news is I now have a clean desk.

Please remember to pray for the children and families in Level 2 of our Religious Education program. They are celebrating First Holy Communion this weekend and next. It is always inspiring and fun to share the Sacrament with the children and their families.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2019-2020 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register**. If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Our program is "home based." Classes do not take place at the Church; rather they are held in the homes of our Catechists. Because of this, there are geographical limits on who we are able to accommodate. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- First time registration needs to be done in person at our office.
- Registration needs to be completed by June 14, 2019.
- Office Hours: Monday – Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to bring a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. **Materials will be sent to your home by the middle of May**, and they may be returned by mail. Please note the deadline of June 14, 2019.

A detailed outline of our program is available on-line or at our office. But, there are a few important details to be noted.

- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is, this is only one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist.



The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.



- Normally prayers begin with “For.” *For our nation, . . .*
- This is not the place for prayers of gratitude. *In Thanksgiving for . . .*
- Prayers should not include any particular agenda or personal opinion.

Depending on how many requests we receive, we will try to include at least one intention per week. It may be necessary to edit the prayer so that its format is consistent with the other prayers.


