This week summer formally arrived. These months are certainly welcomed by our children and young people as they get a break from going to school. Many people have projects around the house or yard that they save for the warmer months. For some folks it may mean travel or a vacation. Hopefully for everyone, it means an opportunity to enjoy some relaxing time, warm sunshine, and a break in the everyday routine of life. Enjoy.

There are a few projects that need attention at the Parish House. The leaders and gutters have needed replacement for over a year now. That repair should be done within the next week or two. But, there are larger projects that need attention. Throughout most of the house there is a laminate floor that has been there for a couple of decades. Unfortunately, boards are wearing out and popping up. Once that happens it is like dominoes; it is difficult to stop the progression. Also, the kitchen has reached the end of its useful life. Cabinet doors are literally falling off, and the wood counter tops are beyond redemption. We are looking into replacing the kitchen. This will be a major improvement, and we are trying to accomplish it in a financially prudent way. The parish has owned the house for over 15 years now and has invested little money in major improvements. While I will enjoy a new kitchen, it is also wise to not let the place fall into major disrepair. Finally, the front patio of the house is in desperate need of a power washing. Is there someone out there who could help me with that project?

There is always a surprise or two around here. Last week, early in the morning someone dropped off a litter of young kittens at the church. Although I am not much of a cat guy, I have to say they were pretty cute. The Animal Shelter was able to take them and should be able to find them good homes. There are many things we can do here, but pet adoption is a bit beyond our ability.

Best wishes to Fr. John Sureau and the people of St. John the Evangelist parish in Center Moriches. This weekend their church is being rededicated. You may recall over a year ago a man barricaded himself inside the church and set it on fire before taking his own life. It was a tragic situation. The parish has functioned for the past year with all services being transferred to the school gymnasium and a former convent. I'm sure it will be a great celebration for them as they move back into their church.

Once a year the Pastoral Team and Office Staff take a day to evaluate the past year and plan for the next. That day will be on Wednesday. All Parish Offices will be closed.

Celebrating Life at Holy Cross

In case you have not heard, our 30th Anniversary Picnic was a huge success. It is hard to say exactly how many people were there. Over 600 responded and there was a spirited crowd throughout the day. The weather could not have been more perfect. Although there was a cloud cover, it kept folks from getting baked in the sun. The live music was a perfect addition to relaxing and having fun on a summerlike afternoon. The kids kept busy for hours with many games and group activities being offered. And, in the course of the day over a thousand hot dogs and hamburgers were grilled.

It is hard to begin to offer an appropriate thank you for all the hard work and planning that went into a day like this. But certainly, our hats are off to Joe and Linda Lescinski who organized the entire event. Some parishioners helped out an hour or two on the day of the picnic. Others were involved for weeks as they helped plan and work out all the logistics for a major undertaking like this.

Some parishioners brought their own tables and chairs and set up an impressive base camp to enjoy the festivities of the day. Others stopped by quickly for a hot dog and were on their way. I am so grateful to all those who participated. The presence of so many made it a great celebration of the spirit of Holy Cross. Good people sharing good times; it was a great blessing.

In addition to the picnic, there is at least one other piece of life at Holy Cross worth noting. Last week we finished our first Alpha program. About 39 parishioners participated in the ten-week program. The "teachings" for the program are done through a series of DVD presentations. The topics all address a person's individual relationship with Jesus. How do we come to know Jesus? How do we grow in our faith? There is a simplicity to each teaching, but it provided a great starting point for beautiful small group discussions.

The format for the gatherings is great. Each evening begins with a meal provided by the parish. It was a bit of a challenge to provide food service on a weekly basis with our limited facilities, but it worked out beautifully. In the course of the program we enjoyed pizza, fried chicken, pulled pork, grilled dogs and brats, soup, tacos, and the final evening was a pot luck supper. The meal takes place before viewing the DVD. Small group discussions follow the presentation.

For those who participated, the consensus was unanimous; it was a great opportunity. We hope to offer this program again in the future so that more parishioners may share in this uplifting and life-giving program.

There is more to come: a performance of Sister Act on July 15, an afternoon of reflection by Sr. Pat Duffy on September 16, and our Dinner Dance on October 19!

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2018-2019 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register.** If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Our program is "home based." Classes do not take place at the Church; rather they are held in the homes of our Catechists. Because of this, there are geographical limits on who we are able to accommodate. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- First time registration needs to be done in person at our office.
- Registration needs to be completed by June 30, 2018.
- Office Hours: Monday Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to bring a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. Materials have been sent to your home early in May and they may be returned by mail. Please note the deadline of **June 30, 2018**.

A detailed outline of our program is available on-line or at our office. But, there are a few important details to be noted.

- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is,



this is only one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist.

The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.

A STATEMENT FROM DANIEL CARDINAL DINARDO

June 13, 2018

Fort Lauderdale, FL—"At its core, asylum is an instrument to preserve the right to life. The Attorney General's recent decision elicits deep concern because it potentially strips asylum from many women who lack adequate protection. These vulnerable women will now face return to the extreme dangers of domestic violence in their home country. This decision negates decades of precedents that have provided protection to women fleeing domestic violence. Unless overturned, the decision will erode the capacity of asylum to save lives, particularly in cases that involve asylum seekers who are persecuted by private actors. We urge courts and policy makers to respect and enhance, not erode, the potential of our asylum system to preserve and protect the right to life.

Additionally, I join Bishop Joe Vásquez, Chairman of USCCB's Committee on Migration, in condemning the continued use of family separation at the U.S./Mexico border as an implementation of the Administration's zero tolerance policy. Our government has the discretion in our laws to ensure that young children are not separated from their parents and exposed to irreparable harm and trauma. Families are the foundational element of our society and they must be able to stay together. While protecting our borders is important, we can and must do better as a government, and as a society, to find other ways to ensure that safety. Separating babies from their mothers is not the answer and is immoral."



Truth Vs Relativism

Veritatis Splendor (The Splendor of Truth) was written by Pope John Paul in 1993 and revolves around man's ability to discern good, the existence of evil and the role of human freedom, human conscience and natural law.

Pope John Paul II emphatically says that moral truth is knowable and there is no contradiction between freedom and following the truth.

Much of our modern culture is based on a belief in relativism which says there is no absolute truth and that truth is merely what a particular individual or culture happens to believe. However, **Veritatis Splendor** insists that moral law is universal across peoples in varying cultures and is, in fact, rooted in the human condition and natural law.

One of the keynote speakers at the annual Rally for Religious Freedom on June 30th will be Father Eric Fasano, Co-Chancellor of the Diocese of Rockville Centre, who will speak about **Veritatis Splendor**. The other speaker will be Sister Constance Viet of the Little Sisters of the Poor. There will be video messages from Bishop Barres and Cardinal Dolan.




