Who Will...?

Pentecost is one of the great celebrations within the Church year. We celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. Unfortunately, the significance of this day sometimes passes too quickly. It is not like Christmas or Easter where there is an entire season that is devoted to it. Nonetheless, it is a rich day that we want to celebrate. It is a day that raises a question of how God may be calling each of us to move more deeply into the gift and mystery of our faith.

There is a two-fold dynamic at work as we celebrate this day. First, we need to understand what we have received from the Holy Spirit. Today's second reading identifies the many gifts and diversity of the Spirit at work in the lives of individuals. The power of the Holy Spirit begins when we acknowledge and embrace what it is God offers us. Once we understand how we have been blessed, then we need to ask the question, "How do I use what God has given?" No gift from God is meant to be hidden or reserved for personal use only. Rather, every gift we have received from God prompts us to respond with a generous heart and use that gift in service of others.

Traditionally, at Holy Cross we connect this annual Feast Day with our Spirituality of Stewardship. We look at our response of time and talent which enables the parish to carry on the work it does on many levels. There are many areas of parish life in which we can identify a great and generous response. This year we pose a question which we ask everyone to reflect upon. "Who will carry on this work?" There are many things that are already being done, but there is always more that can be embraced. If we want to continue to bring our faith to life in a diversity of ways, we need to identify those who will do it. We raise the question, "Who will do this work?" We ask you to reflect upon your response and your relationship with this community. Is it possible that you are being called to more? Might you find yourself responding, "I will," to this invitation?

Sometimes our response finds us immersed in hands-on work. But, this is not the only way in which we can respond. Our financial gifts may be part of our response. Our prayers, support and encouragement may be other ways in which we receive and pass along the gift of the Spirit. If we are truly open to the Spirit, each of us can respond, "I will," when the question "Who will?" is raised in regards to ministry and service.

Please see the special page in this bulletin that identifies some of the areas that could use additional or new helping hands. There may be other things to be done as well. If you feel as though you have something to offer that is not named, by all means, let us know so that we can help you pursue what might be an invitation from God.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2019-2020 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register.** If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Our program is "home based." Classes do not take place at the Church; rather they are held in the homes of our Catechists. Because of this, there are geographical limits on who we are able to accommodate. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- First time registration needs to be done in person at our office.
- Registration needs to be completed by June 14, 2019.
- Office Hours: Monday Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to bring a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. **Materials have been sent to your home in May**, and they may be returned by mail. Please note the deadline of June 14, 2019.

A detailed outline of our program is available on-line or at our office. But, there are a few important details to be noted.

- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and

parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is, this is only one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist.

The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM



Banning "God" from Graduation Speeches

More than two centuries after Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Speech were enshrined in the First Amendment to the Constitution, these rights are often in the news during Graduation season.

- A H.S. graduating senior in PA, whose faith is a driving force behind everything she does, was told to leave any reference to her religious beliefs from her graduation speech.
- A university in CO reversed its decision to remove a Bible verse from the graduation speech of a nursing student selected by her classmates to address the class.
- An IL valedictorian was told just ten minutes before graduation that he would not be permitted to deliver his graduation speech because it was too religious.

Alliance Defending Freedom said, "It is ...well established that (school) officials cannot silence speech simply because it expresses a particular viewpoint, including a religious one."


