# A Hum-Dinger of a Trip

*(Because of vacation schedules, this column was written on July 22.)*

I shared this with some of you on Sunday, July 21. I found myself making an unscheduled trip. There was a family funeral that I needed to celebrate. It was not a close relative; it was the father-in-law of my niece. But, nonetheless, it was important that I be there. The tricky part was that the funeral was in Bismarck, N.D. The flight there should have been 7 hours (one connection). It ended up taking 27 hours. Here are some of the highlights of the trip:

- Circling above Chicago for 1.5 hours
- Being diverted to Cleveland for 6 hours
- Sitting on the tarmac for 1.5 hours with minimal air conditioning
- Waiting for 1.5 hours for an available gate after we landed in Chicago
- Missing a connecting flight by going to the wrong gate (my fault)
- Connecting flights delayed 2-4 hours
- Having my suitcase arrive 5 hours after I did
- Adding an additional city (Minneapolis) to my itinerary and being transferred to a second airline (Delta)

In all my years of traveling, this was the most complicated trip I ever experienced. I share all of this with you not as a complaint, but rather sharing it as a source of good things coming out of unfortunate circumstances. And, if I may add an unsolicited endorsement - three cheers for United Airlines for ultimately getting me there. (They did not cause the storms that created all these delays.)

I tend not to get frazzled or angry too often. As soon as the first delay occurred, I decided to “work the problem” with good humor and determination. Having the right attitude helps so much.

I cannot tell you how many “guardian angels” I encountered along the way: the gate agent in Cleveland who spent a half hour coming up with a very creative itinerary so that I would make it to Bismarck in time for the funeral; the ticket agent in Minneapolis who was comforting and reassuring after I went to the wrong gate; a security guard who randomly pulled me from a long line of people to be the first to go through a new set of screening gates that were just opening; and, many others besides these.

On the Sunday I returned, I was a bit bleary eyed from the 3-day marathon I just completed the night before. In the course of that morning, multiple people asked for my prayers because of surgeries, cancer treatments, and having lost a loved one. Yes, my trip was nuts. But, I was not dealing with anything life threatening or life changing. Keeping proper perspective can make an enormous difference.

This crazy ordeal made the whole experience of actually being there for the funeral so much richer and more meaningful. (It was meant to be.) Sometimes we think that a blessing will be when things “go right.” Sometimes God is more present when things go haywire and it still ends up being OK. I feel so very blessed. Happy Trails . . .



Additionally, there is a parishioner who assists in writing them.

Please suggest any prayers you would like to see included in our worship. Keep the following guidelines in mind:

- Be succinct; the prayer needs to be limited to one or two short sentences.
- Normally prayers begin with “For.” *For our nation, . . .*
- This is not the place for prayers of gratitude. *In Thanksgiving for . . .*
- Prayers should not include any particular agenda or personal opinion.

Depending on how many requests we receive, we will try to include at least one intention per week. It may be necessary to edit the prayer so that its format is consistent with the other prayers.


