

### Mother Nature has Something to Say; Listen to Her

by Father Michael Because of vacation schedules for me and the Office Staff, I found myself up against a deadline (July 22) for three bulletin articles. I wrote the first two for mid-August in a timely way, but now I am down to the final few hours for this one.

I sat down outside the parish house at my patio table to write. I had a blank piece of paper and a blank mind - no ideas. In the course of my sitting, a dramatic little show unfolded before my eyes. Sunny, blue skies suddenly turned dark and threatening. A nice summer calm gave way to gusty winds. Through the trees I heard a distinct sound; a wall of rain slowly moved itself across my yard. Booming thunder and dramatic lightening flashes completed the scene. Mother Nature had just unfurled a dose of her fury. But, as quickly as it came, it passed. It left behind cool fresh air and a sense of a new beginning.

Why are there moments when we need to deal with unexpected and severe conditions? Wouldn't it be easier if the weather changed slowly and gently? There are times when that happens. And, in general, there is an ebb and flow to our climate. But then, there are these moments when Mother Nature unmistakably and dramatically has something to say. Rather than run and hide, can we look at what is happening and see if there is a message for us in the midst of it all?

Is it possible that God wants to demonstrate that experiences of our lives are mirrored all around us, even in the weather? How many of us long for order and predictability in our lives? If we need to deal with change, we don't want it to be abrupt or unsettling. When we find ourselves in the midst of a moment of chaos in our lives, we quickly conclude we must have done something wrong. We become fearful or worried we don't have what we need to make it through whatever the issue may be. It is in moments like that, if we look around with open eyes, God can teach us through nature. Look at the trees in your yard. Occasionally, one may not make it through a violent storm. But, for the most part, they are designed to withstand countless storms through their lives. There will be times of drought, and extreme cold, and endless rains, yet the trees will continue to grow. If God gives that kind of flexibility and resilience to trees, why would He not give that same spirit to His children?

Am I tapping into something profound here that reveals universal truth? Who knows? I do believe God's presence and truth is revealed in many ways for those who seek to find it. But, for the moment, this unexpected cloud burst provided the inspiration I needed to write my final article. I'll take it.


Space is limited to 30 people for each program, and materials need to be ordered, so please get your registration in soon. No prior experience is needed – just a desire to grow closer to God and to one another.
